Annual Report of The Charity Trustees for The Year Ending 30th September 2019

The charity was originally established by way of a trust deed. The governing document is a constitution adopted on 10 September 1994, subsequently amended on 13 June 1999 and 1 February 2012.

On 1 February 2012 the Charity changed its name from The Leukaemia Society (UK) to Leukaemia Cancer Society.

Trustees are elected by the committee after undergoing an interview, followed by a one year induction period.

In shaping our objectives for the year and planning our activities, the trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit. The objectives of the charity have continued this period along the lines of the previous year with regard to supporting leukaemia patients and their families, emotionally and financially with fundraising and with recruiting new stem cell donors. A number of fundraising and awareness generating events have been held during the period including the London Marathon and other National walks proved very successful in raising awareness amongst our target audience, helping the charity to recruit more young donors to the stem cell/bone In shaping our objectives for the year and planning our activities, the trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit. The objectives of the charity have continued this period along the lines of the

Funds have been raised not only from holding events, but also from a number of large and small donations received from organisations and individuals.

The Society's current policy is to build up sufficient reserves in order for the charity to be able to carry on its work, irrespective of anticipated falling income due to the current economic climate. At the year end, the Society had a net bank balance of £98,615 (2018: £154,200) all of which are unrestricted funds. The funds are held in order for the Charity to meet any unforeseen expenditure that may occur, in particular property repairs, and to continue to provide essential support services.

Reflecting over the years, we can see how much has been achieved. The future plans of the Society continue to include the following:-

- a) To recruit stem cell donors for the use in the treatment of leukaemia
- b) To educate the public about leukaemia and the needs of leukaemia sufferers
 c) To promote research into leukaemia and other bone marrow diseases The Leukaemia Cancer Society is supporting the research into Leukaemia stem cells lead by Dr Neil Rodriques at Cardif Univercity. The research group focusses on understanding and therapeutically targeting leukaemic stem cells in the acute myeloid leukaemia.
- d) To offer support to leukaemia sufferers and other bone marrow related diseases
- e) To encourage and maintain a databank of potential stem cell donors

To date the Society has made significant progress towards the above aims and in our tireless effort to support leukaemia sufferers and their families, the following support services have been established:-

- 1. Recruitment of stem cell donors
- 2. Home and hospital visits
- 3. Counselling and accommodation for families and patients
- Some translation services
- 5. Support groups and counselling services
- 6. Telephone help line
- 7. Providing information and awareness seminars on leukaemia and other related diseases
- 8. Forum to provide emotional support to patients and their carers

Despite its constant effort to achieve its objectives, the Society has identified problems that need to be addressed, such as:-

The Society will continue to provide support services as listed above where possible, either at our premises or in alternative accommodation as the need arises. The demand for accommodation for patients has recently dropped. It was decided by the Committee to rent part of the existing accommodation in order to raise much needed funds.

1.1 Basis of accounting
