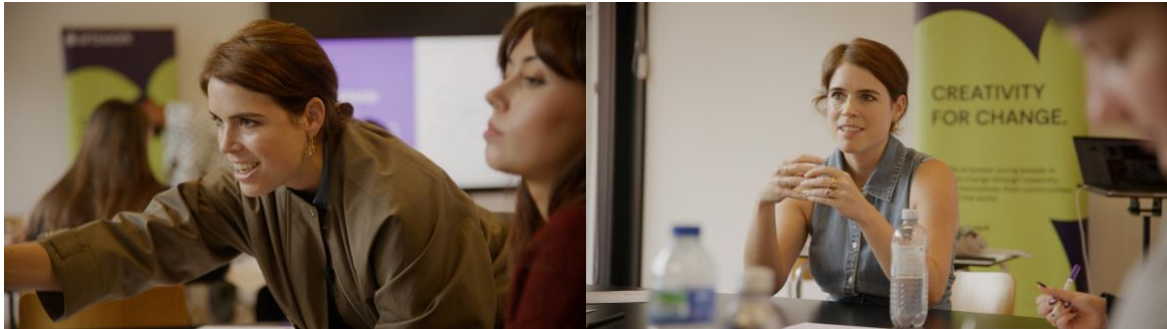
Artswork CEO, Louise Govier commented:
