Food

MISTER SINGH'S INDIA

1 minute walk

ARCAFFE


1 minute walk

Located next to Clifton House and Kelvingrove Park, Arcaffe serves everything from coffees and lunches to three course evening meals. Arcaffe serves authentic Italian dishes, with freshly hand made pizzas and several pasta dishes, with a selection of Italian wines and Prosecco.

ATHENA GREEK TAVERNA

1 minute walk

Located next door to Stewart House, Athena offers authentic Greek and Mediterranean cuisine, as well as great deals for groups and students



Bars

ASHTON LANE

20 minute walk

A cobbled lane tucked in a lane off Byers Road, Ashton lane is lined with bars, restaurants and even a boutique cinema, The Grosvenor. Many of the bars including Brel and Vodka Wodka have beer gardens and so it is a perfect spot on a sunny day!

FINNIESTON

5 minute walk

The area between the city centre and the West End, Finnieston, is the up and coming trendy area of Glasgow. Argyle Street is lined with lots of quirky bars, pop-ups, events and restaurants.

BRASS MONKEY

5 minute walk

Ideal for some cocktails, music, student promos or to watch the sports game.

The Universities

Clifton and Stewart House is located 10 minutes walk away from the University of Glasgow and the Glasgow School of Art. Caledonian University, the Royal Conservatoire and the City of Glasgow College are a 15 minute walk away and the University of Strathclyde is a 25 minute walk. All are accessible by Bus.

Entertainment

There is an extensive range of things to do in Glasgow, some of which is within walking distance of Clifton and Stewart House. From museums to music, Glasgow has something for everyone.

THE SECC & THE HYDRO

5 minute walk

The Scottish Exhibition and Conference Centre (SECC) is Scotland's premier national venue for public events, concerts and conventions. The SSE Hydro is Scotland's best entertainment venue, showcasing national and international music megastars, as well as global entertainment and sporting events.

KELVINGROVE PARK AND MUSEUM

5/10 minute walk

Clifton and Stewart House are located next to Kelvingrove Park, and a 10 minute walk to Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum. The park features a 5 a side football pitch, a café and a bandstand. Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum is adjacent to the park and near the main campus of the University of Glasgow. The museum is free to enter and hosts some of the best collections in the UK, outside of London.

BUCHANAN STREET

20 minute walk

Glasgow is the best shopping city in the UK outside of London. Buchanan Street, the so- called Style Mile, hosts a variety of high street and designer stores. Buchanan Galleries, an indoor shopping centre, is home to over 80 shops.

Travel

BY BUS

There are two bus stops located on Sauchiehall street, 2 minutes walk from Clifton & Stewart House; one which takes you towards the city centre and the bus stop on the other side of Sauchiehall Street will take you further into the west end via the University of Glasgow.

Buchanan Bus station is located on Killermont Street in the city centre, a 20 minute walk from Clifton & Stewart House. From here, you can get buses travelling all over Scotland, including Glasgow and Edinburgh airport.

BY UNDERGROUND

The fifteen stations of the Subway are distributed over a 10 km circuit of the West End and City Centre of Glasgow, with eight stations to the North of the River Clyde and seven to the South. There are two lines: an Outer Circle running clockwise and an Inner Circle running anticlockwise. The nearest subway stations to Clifton & Stewart House are Kelvinbridge and St George's Cross, both, a 15 minute walk away. More information can be found on www.spt.co.uk/subway

BY TRAIN

Charing Cross station and the Exhibition Centre station are a 10 minute walk away. These stations run services to both Central Station and Queen Street Station which both provide services all across Scotland. www.scotrail.co.uk
