RESEARCH EXCELLENCE PLENARY

FOR MID-CAREER RESEARCHERS

The Embassy of Spain and the Executive Committee of the Association of Hispanists of Great Britain and Ireland (AHGBI) invite applications for the 2027 Research Excellence Plenary for Mid-Career Researchers in Hispanic Studies.

Description

The Embassy of Spain and the Executive Committee of the Association of Hispanists of Great Britain and Ireland (AHGBI) are pleased to launch the third edition of the joint **Research Excellence Plenary** scheme, designed to support, and disseminate the work of a mid-career academic.

Eligibility

1. Applicants will be current members of AHGBI who consider themselves mid-career researchers. A mid-career researcher is usually defined as an academic that is more than three years and less than 15 years out from their PhD and has an established research portfolio. Other profiles that fully justify their status as mid-career academics will be considered if appropriate, but please note this scheme is not open to those researchers who have achieved full professorship status.
2. Applicants will be specialists on any research area of Hispanism.
3. Applicants will normally be employed on a full- or part-time basis on 1 October 2026 in a UK or Irish Higher Education Institution.

Details of Award

1. The successful candidate will receive £2000 towards the development a research project to be presented at the AHGBI annual conference as a keynote speaker. It is expected that the costs of attending the conference will come out of the award.

2. The awardee is expected to present their project at the 2027 AHGBI Annual Conference as a keynote speaker.
3. On completion, the awardee is required to submit a 500-word report on the progress achieved.

Guidelines for applicants

Please note – Awardees are required to attend the AHGBI Annual Conference to present their project. On 2027, the conference will take place at the Oxford University on 12-13th April 2027 (in person) and 15th April 2027 (online). Please make sure you can attend the conference prior to applying for this scheme.

Candidates should submit to Alícia Moreno Giménez (a.morenogimenez@lancaster.ac.uk), the Secretary of the AHGBI, the following documents:

- A CV (max. 4 pages)
- A personal statement (max. 500 words)
- Project outline (max. 1,500 words, references not included in the wordcount), including project description, aims and objectives, methodology, timeline and dissemination plans.
- Planned activities (predicted outcomes, participation at conferences)
- Predicted costs, including any intentions to apply elsewhere for funding for this project (with details)

Proposals will be assessed on the following criteria:

- Clarity of the proposal
- Feasibility of the project
- Merit and significance of the project, impact
- Dissemination plans

The selection committee normally will comprise:

- The Cultural Aggregate of the Embassy of Spain in the UK
- The President of the AHGBI
- The Secretary of the AHGBI
- The AHGBI Conference Secretary
- A member of the AHGBI Conference Organising Committee

Key dates

- Launch of the scheme: 1st July 2026
- Deadline to submit proposals: 15th September 2026
- Notification to applicants: 1 October 2026
- Dates of the conference: 12th-13th April (in person) and 15th April 2027 (online)
