Why are we called the ‘Bnei Yisrael’ and what can we learn from this title?

In next week’s Parasha, we encounter the story of Yaakov and the angel fighting. Then in Chapter 32, Verse 39, the angel blesses Yaakov with a new name. Not an added letter to his name, like Avraham and Sarah, but a totally different name. This name is “Yisrael” and from then on Yaakov has a dual name tag: Yaakov and Yisrael. So one could suggest that the nation of Israel are called ‘Bnei Yisrael’ because they are the “Children of Yisrael (meaning the Children of Yaakov)”.

But why are we the “Children of Yaakov”?

Rav Hirsch comments on this week’s Sedra different points which come together to answer the whole theme of the question. In his first commentary of the Sedra, Rav Hirsch suggests that Avraham was the “root of the Jewish people”, Yitzchak was the “growth towards the trunk” and Yaakov was the “real trunk itself”. The first verse of this week’s Sedra shows that Yaakov went on his own journey, just like Avraham.

Rav Hirsch explains the differences. Avraham went with his household, with his wife and an entourage, relations and wealth, whereas Yaakov, by circumstance, went away with nothing as he left it all behind for his brother. So here one could suggest that Yaakov went on the first real journey leaving everything behind but Rav Hirsch goes on to suggest more.

In verse 17, we are told the story of Yaakov having the famous dream of the ladder and angels. Yaakov calls the place ‘Har Habyit’, a “house of G-d”. Rav Hirsch explains that Yaakov is the first person to create the concept of G-d being in a House. This is one reason why we are called the Bnei Yisrael because a lot of the Jewish life is about bringing G-d into our homes.

The Gemara in Pesachim (88a) discusses when Avraham, Yitzchak and Yaakov all visited Har Habayit and what they all called it. Rav Elazar says that Avraham called it a “mountain” (Bereshit, 22:14) Yitzchak called it a “field” (Bereshit, 24:63) and Yaakov called it a “house”. Chazal offer an explanation for this, saying that Avraham faced an “uphill struggle” convincing people to believe and worship G-d, hence why he called it a “mountain”. Yitzchak called Har Habyit a “field” as it was not so much of a struggle for his generation and not like a struggle up a mountain but more like a walk in the field. It was now Yaakov’s responsibility to bring this concept of a house of G-d as a communal hub of hope and a launch pad to worship Hashem.

We see that Yaakov creates the “House of G-d” that brings people and prayer together. The Maharsha comments on the Gemara in Pesachim that Yaakov’s “House of G-d” symbolises the Third Bet Hamikdash and the permanent and complete nature of it.

We are called the Bnei Yisrael after Yaakov because just like he was able to bring the concept of community and shelter into the world, we should carry on that message to our lives.

There's Still a Place for Faith

I had been looking forward to my meeting last Tuesday evening since receiving the notification. Certainly, with a number of my co-invitees there was a wavering moment when the England Wales match became a significant alternative. Even the organisers began to worry that there might be many late no-shows.

The meeting was the annual review and round up of BBC Radio 2's "Pause for Thought" contributors; reception at 6.30pm and Kick Off (both meeting and match at 7.00).

The panel that evening included Helen Thomas, BBC2's Head of Station, who spoke passionately about the station's reach. With over 15 million weekly listeners, Radio 2 is the most popular radio station in the UK. About 1.5 million listen to the Pause for Thought "God Spot" every day on the OJ Borg show, Early breakfast (was Vanessa Feltz, about to be Owain Wyn Evans) or Breakfast with Zoe Ball.

"I'm looking for warmth, wit and relatability". Presenters are required to present a religious message (not preachy!) which is true to their faith.

Michael Wakelin, former head of BBC religious broadcasting, who is the Pause for Thought executive director opened with interesting analysis of the census results, announced earlier in the day. The marked decline in Christian affiliation and considerable rise in other faith affiliation hit the headlines. Notably, faith, itself remains a significant factor in people's lives.

Many non-religious people believe in spirituality, prayer, life after death and God. Almost one in six of non-religious people nonetheless believe in the power of prayer. Only around a half of those who identify as non-religious say they do not believe in God. A fifth said that they definitely or probably believe in life after death. Having no religion does not mean having no beliefs; it doesn't even mean having no religious beliefs.

It is still the norm for people to describe themselves as religious.

My own understanding of faith has strongly been influenced by the teachings of Rabbi Sacks:

Faith has a role in building a strong society. *"In thinking about religion and society in the 21st century, we should broaden the conversation about faith from doctrinal debates to the larger question of how it might inspire us to strengthen the bonds of belonging that redeem us from our solitude, helping us to construct together a gracious and generous social order."*

Faith can help us take control in our lives. *"Part of the beauty of Judaism, and surely this is so for other faiths also, is that it gently restores control over time. Three times a day we stop*



what we are doing and turn to God in prayer. We recover perspective. We inhale a deep breath of eternity."

True faith enables me to contextualise my life in the presence of greater Godliness. *"The test of faith is whether I can make space for difference. Can I recognize God's image in someone who is not in my image, whose language, faith, ideal, are different from mine? If I cannot, then I have made God in my image instead of allowing him to remake me in his."*

Pause for Thought is recorded live, in-programme, to create a seamless integration with the presenter and public broadcast. Most other "God spots" are pre-recorded and slotted in. The Pause for Thought producers send out the themes for each week, having scoured the calendar for significant events.

Over the last year, I have had "Black History Month", "Light in the Darkness" (Diwali), as well as "Wellbeing Tips" and "When things go Wrong". Sometimes the themes are quite taxing. I don't often want to talk about "My Biggest Temptation" to anyone – let alone share it with an invisible audience! At the end of December, I have to review "My 2022".

Tuesday's formalities ended just in time for them to screen the second half of the match while we broke for nibbles and networking. The food was all Kedassia supervised. It was vegetarian (apart from the smoked salmon mezonos whorls), and Halal.

The Jewish contingent this year included Rabbi Alex Goldberg, Trainee Maharat Miriam Lorie (grand-daughter of our member Shirley Arkush), Educator, Laurie Rosenberg and Mitzvah Day's Laura Marks.

The nibbling and networking with the producers and other faith representatives drew much more attention than the football on the big screen. Nonetheless, while I schmoozed and sipped a cool beer, I heard God being thanked as Marcus Rashford and Phil Foden raised the nation's spirits and gave us a fresh glimmer of hope.

JEWISH WOMEN'S AID

This Shabbat is **Jewish Women's Aid Awareness Shabbat** with a particular focus on **Domestic Abuse**.

Tragically, Domestic Abuse is a very real evil within the Jewish Community. It exists at all levels of religiosity and across all levels of income and standards of living.

In my own pastoral experience across different positions, I have seen the enduring trauma caused by

- **physical abuse**, such as hitting and beating
- **emotional abuse** through alienation from friends and family
- **controlling behaviour** through financial control and monitoring of phone calls
- **sexual abuse and degradation**
- **withholding a Gett**, even as the former husband starts new relationships

In every instance, the abuse had been suffered for a long time before I was informed. In many cases, the victim had tried to broach the subject with friends and confidantes five or six times before properly opening up. Often, this was because they were frightened of possible consequences upon their young children. It is frightening to see that even women at the top of prestigious professions can be demeaned by domestic abuse – and how they might feel pressure to endure pain in silence for fear of public embarrassment, stigma or the pernicious suggestion that this came through their misjudgement or fault.

We must make people aware of Domestic Abuse and aware of the services such as **Jewish Women's Aid** that provide confidential counselling and access to refuge and recovery. It is estimated that one in four women in England will experience some form of domestic abuse in their lifetime. It should be noted that Domestic Abuse does affect men, also; however, 73% of victims are women. For many reasons women are more vulnerable.
