Wrestling with Why

Parshat Vayishlach tells of Yaakov’s return to Canaan after his time with his uncle Lavan.

Yaakov is warned that his brother Esau is heading to meet him with a large following and is mindful that at their last encounter, Esau had vowed to kill him. Accordingly, Yaakov adopts three strategic measures. He divides his camp, so that Esau cannot attack them all at once. He sends extensive gifts, in order to appease him. And he prays; because that is what godly people do.

We are then told that the night was falling and during this night, Yaakov wrestled with an angel. It was a tough bout in physical terms. We are told that the angel touched Yaakov’s hip, dislocating it. The Bible says at the end of this encounter that the consequence to this day is that the sciatic nerve and surrounding tissue are considered non-kosher.

It is a puzzlement that the Torah weaves this stand-alone tenet of Kashrut into the Yaakov narrative. The leg of lamb or the rump steak we might want for dinner seem a leap of some distance from the grapplings of Yaakov and his angel.

It is worth a moment to reflect upon the story. Angels are portrayed spiritual beings. Maimonides describes all experiences with them as prophetic-trance encounters. It seems incongruous, then, that they can fight and cause pain. We can understand, though, that Yaakov was wrestling with his demons, if I can borrow that metaphor. It was a conflict of conscience.

Back in the old birthright days, Yaakov had done what he believed had been right – even the duplicity of dressing in his brother’s robes and fooling his father – because he knew, and his mother knew, knew for certain that Hashem had wanted him to inherit.

Though twenty years had passed, Yaakov was still in fear of Esau; in fear of the consequences of the historic trickery. Hashem had protected Yaakov in Lavan’s household – nonetheless Yaakov had to endure the tricks and deceit of his father-in-law who substituted brides under the chuppa and who changed his salary scale ten times.

And just like Yaakov, Lavan too, had acted from his own sense of pure motive. Surely everyone would understand that it was better and more compassionate to marry off the elder sister first. Surely Yaakov would accept that. Surely, too, he would understand that he would have to wait to marry Rachel. After all, how could one signal to Leah that she was a reject. Lavan cared deeply for his daughters’ feelings.

So, Yaakov was worried. Maybe Hashem would protect him from Esau the same way... Yaakov would get through it; but at what cost?

Yaakov wrestles with an angel. Right and wrong, means and ends are often cloudy and complicated areas. Oftentimes what Hashem seems to want and the circumstances He deals us seem discordant or at odds.

Over the years, I have had many distressed congregants come to me and who begin, “Rabbi, I know it is easy for you in life, because you believe that everything is Hashem’s way; you must always be happy, so maybe you won’t understand how I feel...”

I can assure you. This is simply not true. If I didn’t believe in Hashem it would be easy to dismiss pain and suffering as just one of those random things. I could expect nothing other than chance and chance suffering. It is only because I believe in Hashem that I imagine there should be justice. *It is only because I believe in Hashem that I wrestle with the question... “why?”*

When Yaakov says that he will only release the angel if he is blessed, Yaakov is signalling that despite the challenges and adversity, the tough path that Hashem has laid out for him, Yaakov puts his faith in God. He says that the world of faith; the world of spirit and the world of real life are connected. In return Hashem calls him Israel – the one who has wrestled with Hashem and Man and prevailed.

To this day, we carry the name Israel, to remind us of the spiritual challenges and contests we have met – and we do not eat the hindquarters of animals to remind us that our spiritual journey, Hashem’s spiritual expectations are the same world as the world of real life, of hard knocks and difficult choices we often face.

Though we wrestle, may we continue to turn to Hashem in our lives... and may we continue to prevail and continue to merit His blessing.

Simon Goulden writes about the new Siddur Lakol



Some of you will know that part of my life has been devoted to the production of siddurim for our community. It all started with the first children's siddur in 1995 and has gone through the Sacks Singers Prayer book and then a suite of three children's siddurim. Now I have been involved in one of the most challenging, yet satisfying projects, Siddur Lakol, a Siddur for everyone, our new inclusive siddur. It is the result of many months of painstaking work and is thanks to an unprecedented collaboration between ourselves in Tribe, including Rabbi Laitner, and sector specialists JWeb, Geshur School and Kisharon, with the endorsement of Langdon and Norwood. We have had important and valuable input from Rabbi Lawrence and the wholehearted support of the Chief Rabbi throughout the project, which has taken almost two years to come to fruition.

So why, you might ask, do we need yet another siddur? Studies have shown that around 20 per cent of people in the UK have a disability, many of which are not visible. Autism in all its forms, dyslexia or even colour blindness can mean that people, adults and children, simply stay away from shul. Hearing loss is also a major challenge to many in Kinloss and beyond. Within the Jewish community, if someone feels that they are not able to participate in an aspect of community life, this could prevent them and their whole family from attending. That cannot be right.

It is against this backdrop that we have published the first Orthodox siddur to use the Picture Exchange Communication System (PECS) specifically for people with disabilities, both physical or learning. PECS is a set of graphic icons to help those with autism spectrum conditions convey their thoughts and needs.

The siddur concentrates on Kabbalat Shabbat, parts of the Shabbat morning service and Havdalah, as these are services which we know shuls have found likely to attract this community. All prayers and songs appear in the siddur with transliterations for those members, family or carers, who cannot read Hebrew together with matching PECS, offering a more meaningful prayer experience to users.

Here are some examples from the new Siddur Lakol.



As we know, Judaism has, from its very beginnings, accepted that humans come with abilities and disabilities. We read in the Torah that our forefather Yitzchak was blind in his old age. His son Yaakov was left physically disabled, either temporarily or permanently, after his wrestling incident. Our greatest teacher, Moshe, had a speech impediment. In none of these cases did that affect their ability to perform their role of leader, or to be involved in community life. They, in turn, were respected for who they were. While Moshe might have doubted himself because of his stutter, at no point in the Torah are we told that the people resented or ignored Moshe because of his disability.

Supported and encouraged by Chief Rabbi Mirvis, the new accessible Siddur Lakol is now available in our shul. With its unique illustrations and simplified translations, it is a ground-breaking addition to our publication portfolio. In addition, we are offering explanatory videos for leaders of adult, youth and children's services, produced by us and Geshur School. We have already had expressions of interest to acquire copies from communities outside of the United Synagogue and, indeed, orthodox communities around the world.



We know the publication of this siddur is just the start of our journey. We still need to work to remove physical and attitudinal barriers by making spaces more accessible for people with disabilities and by raising awareness in the wider community.

Of course, supporting some 60 United Synagogue communities in this area is a marathon and not a sprint. But we are taking the first steps. Investing in this work takes time but we have already seen the difference it makes to our members, and we are here to support each and every one. After all, at the very beginning of the Torah, we are told that we are all made B'tzelem Elokim, in the image of God. We look forward to driving this vital work forward and I am sure that Kinloss will be in the vanguard.

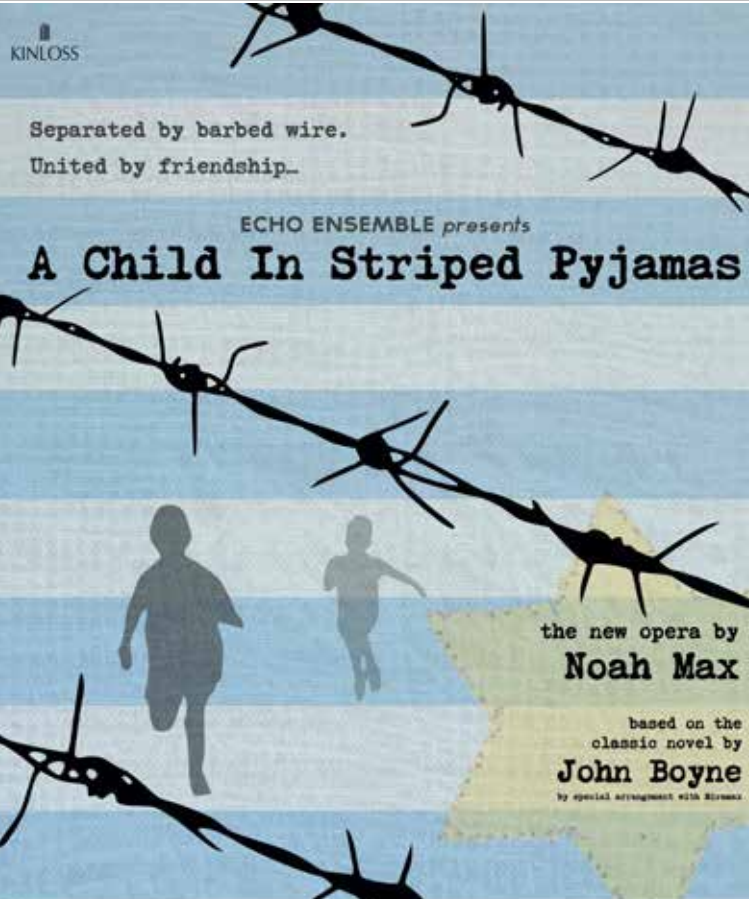

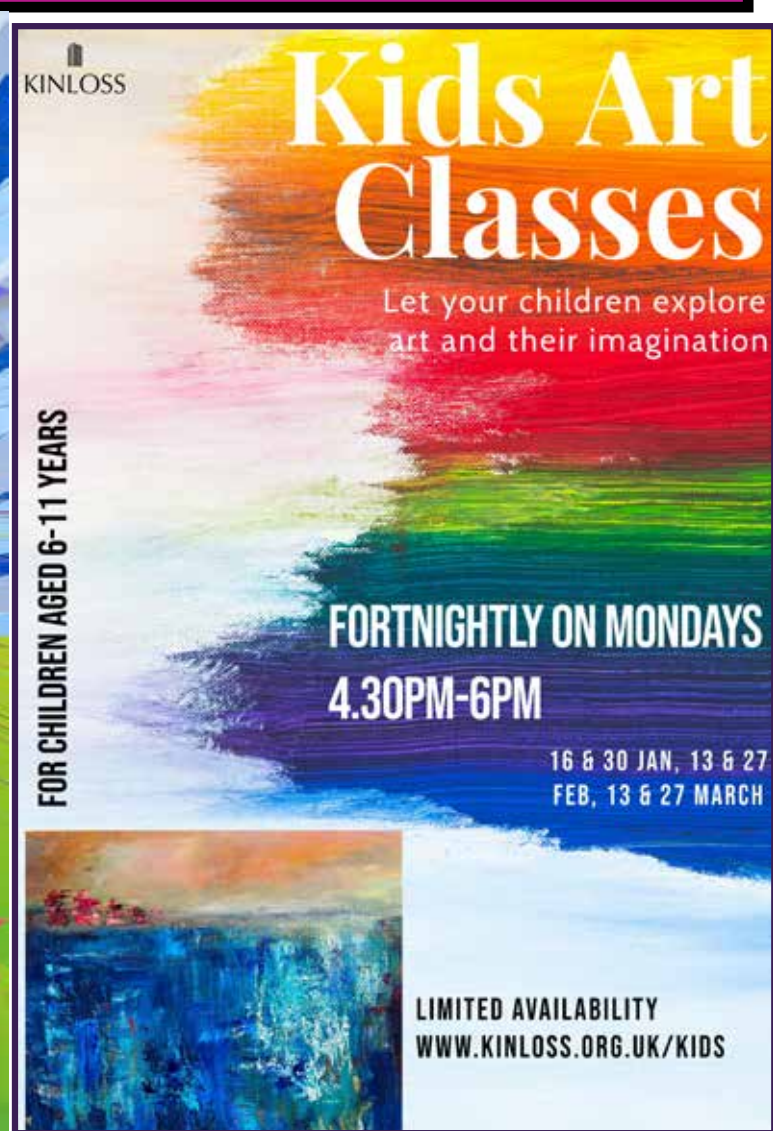
