Water then, water now...

“And the servants of Yitzchak dug in the wadi, and they found a well of ‘mayim chayim’ (living waters) there. And the shepherds of Gerar strove with the shepherds of Yitzchak saying, ‘the water is ours!’ And he [Yitzchak] called the well ‘eisek’ (strife), since they argued over it.” (Bereishit 26:19-20)

Toledot is famous for the struggle between Yaacov and Esav over the birthright and its associated blessings for them and their descendants. Yet in between the account of that struggle, the Torah records events which do not ostensibly relate to that struggle but nonetheless provide a very important context to it.

Control of water supplies has long been a source of contention in the Middle East. This contention has not just been between the modern State of Israel and its neighbours but goes all the way back to the relationship between our Patriarchs in the Land of Israel and their neighbours, such as the inhabitants of Gerar, as recorded in chapter 26 of Bereishit which we read in Toledot.

The battle over water supplies then too was a battle for control over the Land of Israel. The blessings which God gave Yitzchak and which Yitzchak would request to pass to the holder of the birthright would help that holder continue to assert that control.

Water is also understood by the Rabbis of the Midrash to be a metaphor for Torah. Ramban (Rabbi Moshe ben Nachman, d. 1274) in his commentary to these verses, amplifies these rabbinic understandings of water as relating to both control of Israel and to Torah.

The use of ‘mayim chayim’ (verse 19 above) to name the well refers, according to Ramban, to the Temple which Yitzchak’s descendants would later construct, a place from where Torah would light up the world. Sadly, the use of ‘eisek’ (verse 20 above) refers to the attempts by our enemies, which tragically were successful, to destroy the Temple and oppress our people so that those enemies could assert their control over the Land and subdue the ‘mayim chayim’ of the Torah.

Ramban uses this approach to explain the names of each of the other wells mentioned in this chapter too.

The approach of Ramban can be viewed as describing a continuing manifestation of the struggle between Yaacov and Eisav, through their descendants, throughout the generations.

More happily, in recent years, water has also become a source of opportunity as agreements between Israel and Jordan in particular about sharing water supplies has been important in underpinning the 1994 peace treaty between both countries. What was once a source of contention, has become, in this case at least, a source of understanding and accommodation.

Our prayer is that the blessings of the birthright will be fully granted as soon as possible to Am Yisrael and that we will be able to continue using them to build a profound and mutually-beneficial relationship with those around us.

Dayan Chanoch Ehrentreu ztz"l

The news has just reached us about the passing of Dayan Chanoch Ehrentreu ztz"l.



Fuller obituaries will follow, but I have some immediate recollections of a Torah giant, a man of unwavering principle and profound compassion.

Certainly, his role as Rosh Beth Din of the London Beth Din from 1984-2006 saw him as the bulwark of strict halacha against pressures for change. I knew him, perhaps slightly compared to others, for his caring and his insight as well as his Torah.

My earliest encounter with the Dayan was while I was embarking on Semicha. The Beth Din was involved in a divorce which was reluctantly granted, though by no means one of the tragic cases of Aguna. The gett had been hard fought for. I heard from the wife how helpful the Dayan had been; and how, amidst the sad solemnity of the occasion, the Dayan's demeanour conveyed reassurance and celebration at the moment of release.

When I was appointed to the position as Senior Rabbi of the Auckland Hebrew Congregation in 1996, I was invited to a meeting with Dayan Ehrentreu, who discussed with me some of the challenges and pressures that I might face as a rookie rabbi in the Antipodes. He reassured me that the London Beth Din was only a phone call away and that he looked forward to me remaining in touch. He then introduced me to Dayan Gelley, so that I should know him, too. Dayan Gelley spent an hour or so with me, learning the halachot of commercially baked bread. I discovered later, as I supervised Kashrut across the two islands, that it was a more practical shiur than I had anticipated. Dayan Ehrentreu had wanted me to feel a part of a greater team.

Over my almost 18 years in Auckland and Sydney, I would meet with the Dayan whenever I was back in London. In the earlier years, we discussed Kashrut extensively; the details of ensuring provisions of basics for the locals, retention of Shechita and how

to ensure that all AHC smachot were supervised Kosher. We discussed the commercial aspects of licensing and the challenges of competing international authorities. The Dayan was on top of details and completely sympathetic to the needs of the aspirationally observant in a world where the family Pesach order needed to be placed before Channuka to guarantee delivery of matzot on time!

We had a lengthy correspondence on Brit Milah, where we needed to bring a mohel across from Sydney or Melbourne (at community expense) as there was no Shomer Shabbat practitioner in Auckland at the time. As a consequence, every Brit ended up on the Sunday after the eighth day. When NZ medical insurance laws changed, making the arrangement unworkable, the Dayan enabled a transition of practice and the rehabilitation of a local surgeon as mohel. This was no easy volte face and I found Dayan Ehrentreu strenuous in getting to grips with the issues and the personalities and stakeholders.

Though his strong stance against Orthodox Rabbonim attending Limmud here was well-known, I found Dayan Ehrentreu approachable on a discussion of LimmudOz. Even controversial judgement calls were based on a searching understanding of situations; and where exceptions could and should be made, I found the Dayan engaged as a scholar, a posek and a mensch.

Locally, the Dayan's leadership of the Eruv has been transformative – and the London I returned to was very different from the one I had left.

Pre-Covid, Dayan Ehrentreu remained a popular lecturer at Rabbinic conferences. The material was fluent, the delivery eloquent; his knowledge and ability to locate and quote texts from memory, genuinely awesome.

We go into Shabbat as a community bereft of a true Torah giant. For many, an inspiration, a mensch and a mentor. We have seen him fierce. We have seen him illuminate a room with his joy. May his memory be a blessing and may Hashem give comfort to all his family.

This Shabbat has been designated for **Chai Cancer Care Awareness**. Many of us are all-too aware of cancers – I remember, as a child, the word being whispered by sage adults with grim and knowing faces. Today it is more discussed, better screened, better treated and better understood. We are also more conscious of the impact on families and what we can do to help them. I was recently taken around Chai Cancer Care's remarkable facilities by Ian Kamiel and saw the calming ambience, the therapy options – with dedicated rooms for art, music and aromatherapy, areas for children and families, exercise, haircare and manicure. So much about coping stems from calming and restoring self-image. Chai currently supports 3,500 people aged from 3-93. 60% of clients are patients. 40% are family members. Chai does not charge for its services.

We may be well aware of cancer, and many of the patients I have encountered in the community are medically well supported, we may be less aware of the ongoing support therapies and counselling available – particularly for the family members. People have spoken to me about feeling guilty for feeling the strains, when it is their spouse or parent who is the patient.

Chai Cancer Care is just around the corner. It is professional and confidential and provides a variety of outstanding services.

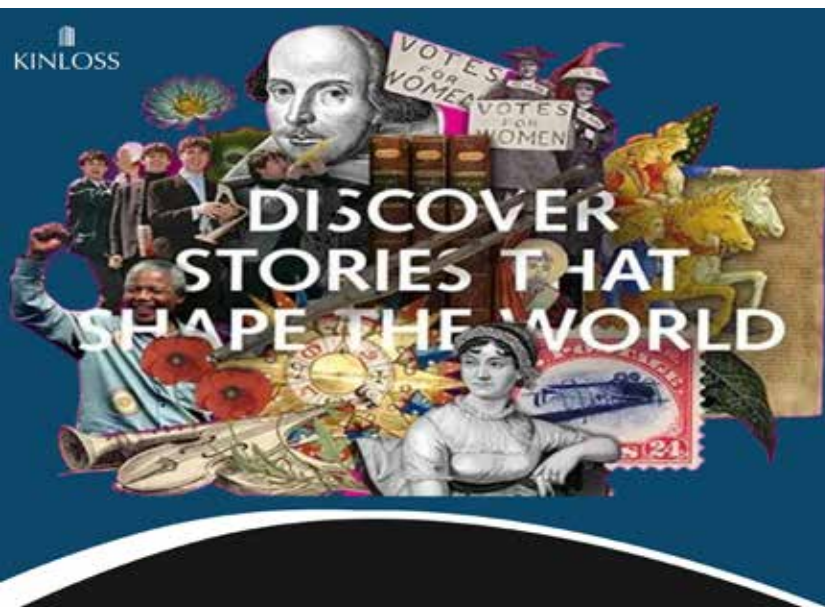

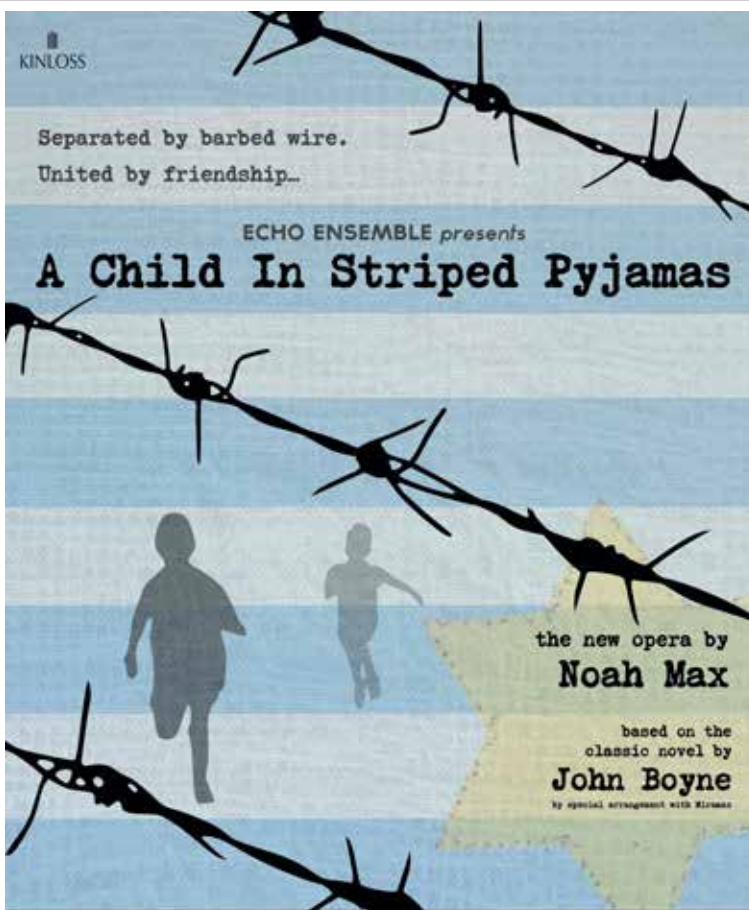

We let the Dogs In!

Two weeks ago, Kinloss was delighted to host an "In Conversation" event in conjunction with the Israel Guide Centre UK.

Rabbi Lawrence spoke with IDF veteran Benzi who had travelled to London with his wife Irit, and his service dog, Lugo. Benzi was also accompanied by Yariv, a trainer from the Centre in Israel who now specialises in training PTSD Service dogs.



Since providing his heroic service to the IDF, Benzi had in recent years suffered from the debilitating effects of PTSD. So much so that he explained he would go through periods of not wanting to leave the house and not interacting with his wife and family. Benzi explained that receiving Lugo as a service dog was a "game-changer" for him. When he was introduced to Lugo, it was love at first sight. And Benzi described how he immediately felt some of the stress leave his body. Now, when he has a nightmare or flashback, Lugo springs into action bringing about a remarkable change. Indeed, the fact that Benzi was able to travel to London and speak about his experiences is testament to this.

PTSD Service dogs are those dogs that may not have been able to meet the exacting standards required to be a Guide Dog but are still trained to a very high level and therefore are able to provide support to others in need. They are trained to pick up on signals from their partner and act on this and seek to bring their partner's focus on them.

The Israel Guide Dog Centre works with the Israel Ministry of Defence to support these veterans and provide them, where possible, with a fully-trained and matched PTSD Service dog. This service is provided alongside its Guide Dogs service together with the provision of emotional support dogs to children with autism.

Veterans give their all for their country both on a physical and emotional level.
