Avraham, Gidon and the curious story of the Book of Maccabees

This week's Sedrah, Chayei Sorah, tells the story of Avraham asking his servant, Eliezer, to go to Charan to find a partner for Avraham's son, Yitzchok. Eliezer asks Avraham what he should do if the woman he finds for Yitzchok doesn't want to go back with him, and Avraham explains that Eliezer is then absolved from his mission. Eliezer goes to Charan and waits at the well, he decides that if he asks one of the women for water and they also offer water to his camels, then that will be a sign that this is Yitzchok's soulmate. Rivka does indeed offer water to Eliezer and to his camels, and Eliezer goes back with her to her family to explain why he is there. At this point, the Torah repeats everything we have just been told. Eliezer tells Rivka's family that he is a servant of Avraham, he repeats the conversation he had with Avraham before he left, the sign he made at the well etc. We already know all of this, why is it all repeated?

There is a difference in how the story is told when Eliezer repeats it. The first time he asks Avraham what he should do if the woman does not want to come back with him the verse says: וַיֹּאמֶר אֵלָיו ... (24:5) the word **אולי** means perhaps. When Eliezer recounts the story, the word 'perhaps' is written without a 'ו' - **אלי**. Rashi explains: "The word 'אלי' 'perhaps' is written without a 'van' and may be read **אלי** 'to me'. Eliezer had a daughter, and he was hoping that Abraham would turn to him, to marry Isaac off to his daughter."

Surely the **אלי** without the ו (meaning 'to me') should have been written when Eliezer was speaking to Avraham rather than when he was recounting the story to his hosts and trying to convince them to let their daughter, Rivka, come with him. Wouldn't he be undermining his own mission if he was trying to persuade Rivka's father (Lavan) to let his daughter go with him and at the same time hint that he really wanted Yitzchok to marry his own daughter?

Rabbi Menachem Mendel of Kotzk (1787 – 1859) explains that Eliezer was not consciously aware that he opposed the shidduch. Consciously he was a devoted and loyal servant and committed to fulfilling his mission. When he speaks to his hosts, he introduces himself as the "servant of Abraham". Of course, Eliezer was aware that he had the conversation with Avraham about wanting his daughter to marry Yitzchok. Avraham had explained it was not a suitable shidduch and Eliezer accepted that. However, as long as Eliezer was unaware that part of him didn't want the mission to be successful, he was subconsciously stopping it from happening.

The Torah tells us the story again, as when Eliezer shared the story, he became aware of his conflicting feelings. This is why it says **אלי** the second time. Once Eliezer realised he had an ulterior motive, he was able to set his personal agenda aside and successfully complete his mission.

Eliezer was a true servant of Avraham, but he also had his own agenda and was honest about this. We all have times when we feel torn or have underlying fears or conflicting emotions that may be keeping us stuck in one area or another. There is no shame in this, this is human nature. No one is perfect, and G'd does not expect this from us. Our struggle is where growth takes place. When we do the difficult work of confronting our thoughts and deepest emotions, talking about them with a trusted individual and evaluating them with honesty, we are able to deal with them. If we allow these conflicts to live in our head or our hearts, we give them space to grow. If we bring these into the light and look at them honestly, we are able to move forward. Eliezer was a loyal servant to Avraham but was also able to be honest and transcend his inner struggle, thereby becoming a catalyst in the marriage of the founding mother and father of our People.

Dvar Hashem MiYrushalayim

Many thanks to everyone who assisted with and participated in the many events with Rabbi Professor Avraham Steinberg over last Shabbat. Two particular highlights were the Oneg Shabbat at Mark & Eleanor's and the shiur after Shabbat at Toras Chaim.

In the Oneg, Rav Steinberg talked about being a young doctor just as research enabled the testing of a foetus for genetic abnormalities. Previously, all pregnancy and birth responsa had only been able to address or be informed by the physical and mental wellbeing of the mother. This new dimension required the gedolim of the time, Rav Tvi Waldenburg (Tzitz Eliezer – resident Posek at Shaarei Tzedek Hospital), Rav Shlomo Zalman Auerbach, R' Moshe Feinstein, R' Eliyashiv and R' Moshe Tendler to become acquainted with the new science and fit it into the matrix of existing psak. R' Steinberg was directly involved in the communications between them in responsa and in the journals. He spoke about their personalities and approaches as well as how the halachic approaches to Tay Sachs and other, non-hereditary conditions were developed.



At Toras Chaim, R' Steinberg spoke about a case where the wrong fertilised egg had been

implanted into a mother. The error was later discovered; another likely parental couple were found not to be the parents, leaving a pool of around 40 couples who might be the true donors of the embryo (now a live baby). The birth family had naturally developed an affinity to their child. Nonetheless, there is an interest in establishing the genetic parents to rule out possible relationships between biological siblings, halachic inheritance etc. The matter is as yet unresolved. The baby's birth is registered but in law the parents are as yet not designated. On Monday evening we were delighted to host Fleur Hassan-Nahoum, the deputy mayor of Jerusalem.

Fleur was able to update us on recent developments in the city, the implications of the Israeli elections and her work with the city's very diverse communities. As Israel's capital she is vocal that embassies need to move into the city and respect Israel's sovereignty. She is proud of the light rail and infrastructure. She is wary of growing the city through sprawling suburbs. The peripheral towns such as Mevaseret do not want to become absorbed.

The population of Jerusalem is approximately twice that of Tel Aviv. Its composition is 20% Charedi and 40% Arab.

It has the largest population of both and is also Israel's poorest city. Despite Israel being a first world economy, Jerusalem faces hunger poverty. The proportion of Jewish men in work is low. A lower percentage of Arab women are in the workplace than in Saudi Arabia – as they are currently educated under a Palestinian curriculum which disengages them from Israel and Ivrit. The boys pick it up on the street. Charedi women, by contrast are widely employed. It is their husbands who lack essential numeracy.



Fleur is working with the grassroots to replace the curriculum of hatred, bypassing the leadership through innovation. Independent work is being done to create religious and culturally appropriate teaching for the Arab and Charedi communities.

Fleur is optimistic at the new government. She considers it a chance to break free of the last five years of paralysis. She is a proud Likudnik and a pragmatist. Inflammatory ideological rhetoric is unhelpful to resolving the needs on the ground.

An active participant in the Abraham accords and work with the UAE, she sees what can be achieved.

She describes the DNA of Jerusalem as diversity and inclusion.

This week has also seen the Epiphany Film on Sunday, Simon Goulden's Israel Off the Beaten Track series on Tuesday, the continuation of 8am Shacharit and shiur as well as Lunch and Learn on Wednesday.

A new event to look forward to is a tour of the British Library on Thurs 15th December. Our guide is Kevin Mehmet, who has been with the Library for 40 years and is responsible for acquiring donated collections of books. We will see some of Library's great treasures (including Hebraica) as well as a trip into the inner workings, to see how books are acquired, stored, ordered and transferred. 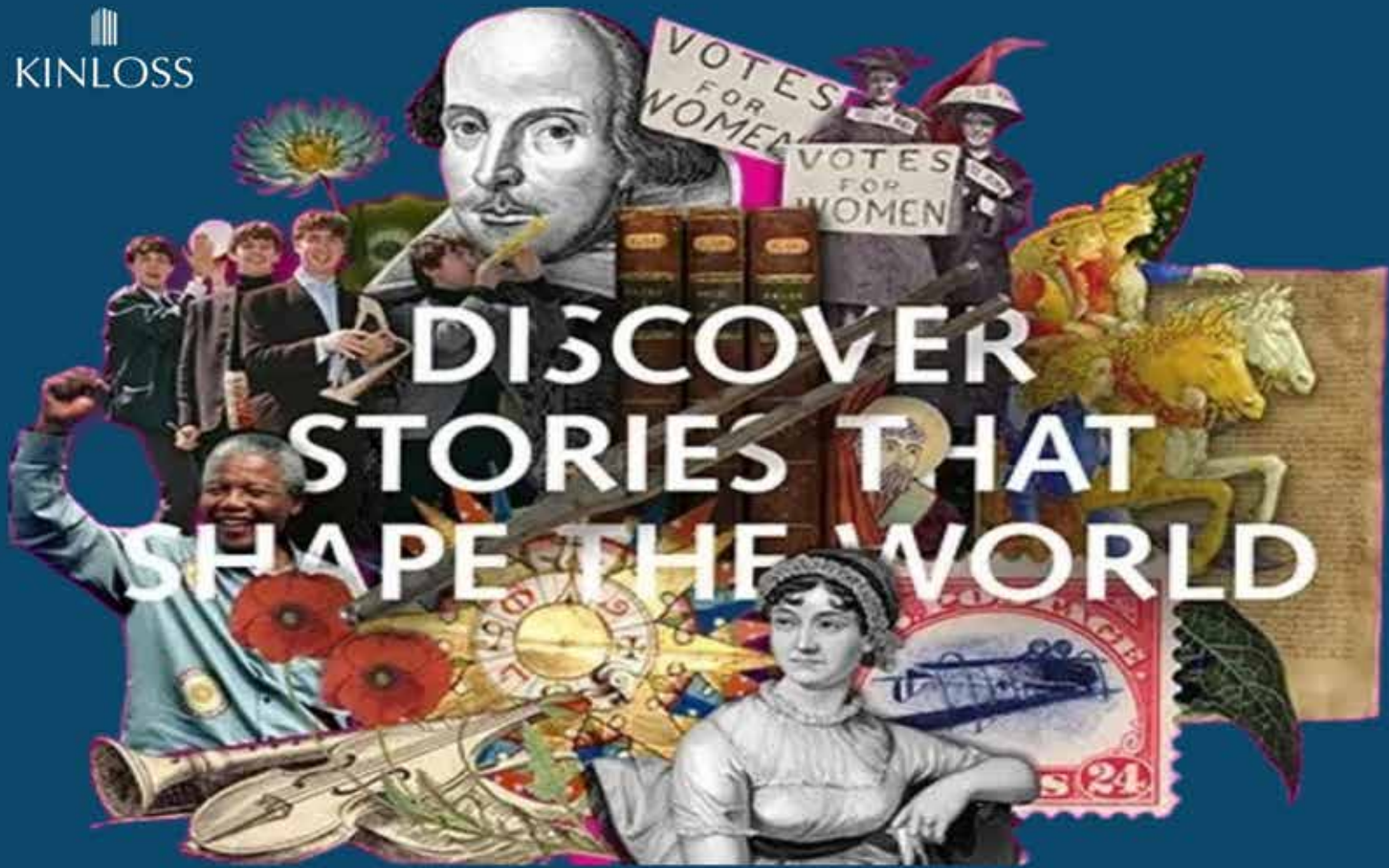
