The people - no sense of guilt



The enemy who is going to attack Judah from the north will take the bones of the dead out of their graves and spread them out. They will then lie, so to speak, before the "eyes" of the sun, moon and stars, who they had served (vv1-3).

God accuses His people of having less common sense than the migrant birds who return each year, whilst the Jews wouldn't be prepared to do that (vv4-9).

That's why He has to repeat what He had already said in chapter 6 (vv10-13). As far as his emotions were concerned, the prophet Jeremiah was anything else than a block of ice. You can see this in his sad emotions which he expresses in a conversation with God (vv14-23).
