## **Mocking and threats**



The enemies are annoyed and mock. But instead of answering them, Nehemiah prays to his God. If someone laughs at you because you love the Lord Jesus, do the same: Don't allow yourself to be annoyed, but pray for those who want to put you down.

There's serious danger ahead: The building site is facing an attack! The Jews pray to God for help and organise a round-the-clock watch of the site. Nehemiah encourages the workers by reminding them of God's power. Joy in God fills you with strength – you can experience this today!

- 13. How often had the workers been warned that the enemies were planning an attack?
- 14. What weapons did the Jews intend to use in case of an attack?

Tobiah used his mocking words in verse 3 because he wanted to say that the wall of the Jews was certainly not solid enough to withstand an enemy attack.
