Brigantes Lecture: Dr Gervase Phinn



Author, poet, comedian, broadcaster and former Speaker of the Year. A Yorkshireman through and through.

Dr Gervase Phinn, born in Rotherham, is a former North Yorkshire schools inspector. Now dubbed 'the James Herriot of schools, his wealth of delivering entertaining tales and stories can be found in print, on radio broadcasts and television, and of course online.

He received the 'Speaker of The Year Award' from the Association of Speakers Clubs. He is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts and an Honorary Fellow of the English Speaking Board.

He has written many publications including three autobiographical novels known as 'The Dales Series' which include *The Other Side of the Dale, Over Hill and Dale* and *Head Over Heels in the Dales* which was a Radio 4 'Book of the Week'.



We are definitely looking forward to a morning of being entertained. His talk, with often hilarious, witty and sometimes poignant accounts of his experiences as a schools inspector in the Yorkshire Dales amongst other short stories of his life will be an excellent start to our day.

Rt Revd Barry Hill, Bishop of Whitby



Rt Revd Barry Hill served the first 20 years of his ministry in the Diocese of Leicester before his consecration in 2024 as the Bishop of Whitby.

Originally from Shoreham in West Sussex, and a passionate Brighton & Hove Albion supporter, the Bishop, now with Middlesborough FC's Riverside Stadium within his remit, has displayed commendable tact and diplomacy, the crests of both clubs now featuring on his robes.

Judith Donovan CBE



Well known to many in Yorkshire, the North and across the Livery, Judith is a member of several Companies including the Marketors, the Woolmen and the Tobacco Pipe Makers.

She was one of the first female entrepreneurs in Yorkshire, founding her own marketing agency in 1982. She became an entrepreneur 'by accident'! She said: "Anyone can start their own business. If I did it, you can too".

Her former roles have included being a Millennium Commissioner, Director of HSE and the BIG Lottery Fund, and Chair of the Eden Project and of the Yorkshire Tourist Board.

Judith is currently a Trustee of the Science Museum Group, which includes the National Railway Museum, a Trustee of the National Army Museum, on the Advisory Boards for two women's prisons and an Honorary Canon of Ripon Cathedral, where she Chairs the Cathedral Council.

She has a story of 'winning against all odds', real and honest and definitely inspiring. As a self-confessed 'petrol head' she began her career as a marketing graduate at Fords. She may even share her top 10 lessons learned whilst building her very successful business.
