2025 Brigantes Golf – Royal Liverpool

Brigantes Golfers were treated to marvellous hospitality, spectacularly good weather and a hole in one at the Open Championship links of Royal Liverpool Golf Club (RLGC).

Royal Liverpool has a worthy reputation as one of the finest Open Championship venues. Brian Harman, Rory McIlroy and Tiger Woods are Royal Liverpool's last three Open Champions – testimony to the skill required to triumph over these hallowed fairways.



Tuesday evening, 29 April, saw a highly convivial reception and dinner in the Clubhouse. A number of non-golfing Liverymen joining us to enjoy the fellowship, beautiful views of the course and lovely surroundings. We enjoyed first class fare and fine wines with the Toast to Brigantes proposed most eloquently by Arthur Noble, Past Captain of Royal Liverpool.









Then, come Wednesday morning it was down to the real business rewarded under cloudless skies, a flat calm and balmy temperatures in the high 70s.

In teams of four, including one RLGC member in each, Liverymen from across the UK teed off in the annual Brigantes Spring Meeting.



The fast-running fairways and immaculate greens brought out the very best in the strong field of experienced players, and the scoring was excellent.

Driving here at the 11th is David Collinge (Weaver), with Wendy Giardelli (Lightmonger) and Mark Matthews (RLGC member).



Royal Liverpool's halfway house provided timely refreshment, in this case for Christian Brash (Tyler & Bricklayer), Jane Matthews (Lady Captain, RLGC), Keith Artus (Maker of Playing Cards, resplendent in colourful playing-card shirt), Annabel Barton (Spectacle Maker and RLGC member) and Ian Davies (Past Master Spectacle Maker).



At the later prize-giving dinner the Lady Captain presented the winners - Michael Colyer (Fishmonger), Team Captain Ian Clokey (Master Mariner) and Marilyn Luson (Immediate Past Mistress Turner) - with Brigantes engraved glasses for their magnificent score of 94 stableford points.



Second prize, and only 3 points behind the winning team, were Malcom Arthur (Tallow Chandler), David Collinge (Weaver), Wendy Giargelli (Lightmonger) and Mark Matthews (RLGC member).

Third place went to Christian Brash (Tyler & Bricklayer), Jane Matthews (Lady Captain, RLGC), Keith Artus (Maker of Playing Cards) and Ian Davies (Past Master Spectacle Maker).

The Ladies Prize, awarded for the best points scored by a lady over four nominated holes, went to Marilyn Luson (Immediate Past Mistress Turner).

The Nearest the Pin competition, on the notoriously difficult 15th hole, went to Wendy Giardelli (Lightmonger) **for a remarkable hole in one!**

With recognised odds of 12,500-1 against, holes in one are very rare. For a Brigantes golfer to achieve 'the ultimate shot' therefore had to be rewarded with not just the planned "Nearest the Pin" prize but also with an unplanned bottle of Champagne.



The Master of the Worshipful Company of Distillers again donated a bottle from The Master's Cask for our charity draw – a fine 15 year old Royal Brackla malt.

The draw was undertaken by the Lady Captain and won by David Homer (Clerk to the Tallow Chandlers), below.

The Master's Cask could not have fallen into better hands! The funds raised were donated to the Maggies Wirral Cancer Care Centre, chosen by the Lady Captain.



For those with a demanding programme for the rest of the week, it was then time for home.

Others however could savour this glorious sunset over Liverpool Bay before heading to nearby Caldy Golf Club the following morning.



There, Mike and Annabel Barton (Past Master and Mistress Spectacle Makers), who had already assisted so much with the arrangements at Royal Liverpool, where both are members, organised a further round for us, again in glorious weather.



The lovely Caldy course, an Open regional qualifier running beside the Dee Estuary, provided another enjoyable day's golf as well as superb long-distance views along the North Wales coastline.

And while the golfers were toiling on both days, the non-golfers immersed themselves in the many delights of this wonderful part of Cheshire, including walks and a pub lunch overlooking the Dee and visits to nearby Chester.

Finally, we are most grateful to the members and staff of Royal Liverpool and Caldy who gave of their time and hospitality so generously, making the 2025 Brigantes Spring Meeting yet another successful occasion for everyone.

For those able to arrive early, we will be assembling at 10.30 in the Spa Theatre at the Spa for our everpopular Brigantes Lecture.




This this year's speaker will be Yorkshireman, Dr Gervase Phinn.
