

## The Golden Rules

# End of school

- © Collect all of your belongings when you are told.
- © Stand behind your chair and wait to be called by your teacher.
- © Walk sensibly through school and out through the school gates.
- Do not play on the handrails after school. Make your way home.
- You are not allowed to walk through the school car park.
- Walk home sensibly. Remember you are still wearing school uniform and representing the school. We expect the same of you walking home as in school.
- Remember if you are going to an after school club held at behave in the same way as in lessons.



### Assembly

- © Come into assembly quietly and sit in a straight line.
- © Listen carefully to any music that might be playing.
- Listen carefully to the assembly so that you can join in sensibly if asked.
- Do your best to concentrate on what is said in the assembly and do not talk or distract others.
- Leave the hall quietly at the end of assembly and return to your classroom.

## **Classroom Expectations**

### Registration

- Make sure your coat is hung up and your bag and belongings are put away neatly.
- © Get on with the morning task straight away.

### When You Choose Your Learning

- © Use your indoor voice.
- © Don't run inside.
- Move around quietly and sensibly.
- © Look after the toys and things in the class.

### Carpet Time

- When an adult talks to the whole class sit quietly and listen to what they say.
- Look at the person who is talking to you.
- In class put your hand up and don't shout out.
- Listen to each other.

### End of the lesson

- Put everything away so the classroom is always left tidy.
- © Your teacher will tell you when you can leave the classroom.
- © Your teacher will tell you when you can leave the room.

## Before School, Playtimes and Dinner times

- Break times are a time to enjoy yourself and have fun. Play sensibly. Remember, play-fighting is not allowed.
- © Follow instructions from the lunchtime supervisors the same as instructions from teachers.
- © Do not go into a classroom unless an adult is in the room.
- <sup>™</sup> When going out to play always walk through school.
- If the ball goes over the fence, tell a member of staff and they will collect it.
- Unkind words can be very hurtful. Be a good friend and say the right things. Make helpful supportive and friendly comments. Say no to name calling.
- When the whistle goes, stand still do not talk. When the teacher holds up your class's number walk back into school quietly.
- © Before you eat your dinner wash your hands.
- © Line up quietly when waiting in the dining hall.
- © Sit down when you are eating your dinner.
- © When you have finished your meal, clear your things away.
- If you need to come into school at lunchtime you must get permission from a lunchtime supervisor.
- Remember to respect everyone and use 'Please' and 'Thank you' whenever you can.
- © Help keep the school tidy by putting rubbish in a bin.



# wet playtimes or dinner times

Wet Break in the Hall: be careful moving around—the hall is very full. When the whistle goes sit on the floor and wait for your class to be called.

### Wet Dinnertimes

- Stay in your own classroom unless you are told otherwise
- © Find something to sit and do, like reading, drawing, talking or playing games.
- © Respect the games and equipment you use at wet playtimes.
- Tidy everything away neatly and quickly when you are asked to.
- If you need the toilet, ask an adult for permission to go.
- Do not run around the classroom or the corridors.
- Make sure you listen to any adults instructions and do what they ask without arguing.
