



Seasons

There are 4 seasons: Autumn, Winter, Spring and Summer. Each season brings key changes which affect people, animals and plants.

Andy Goldsworthy is a British sculptor, known for his use of natural materials. He often uses rocks, branches, leaves or ice and arranges them in different shapes and patterns.



Trees

Trees are living things that are very important for the environment. They have some key parts that each have a special job in helping the tree grow and stay alive.


Roots- suck up water and nutrients from the soil and keep the tree in place.

Trunk- supports the tree and carries water from the roots. Usually covered in bark which protects the tree.

Branches- hold the leaves and carry water around the tree.

Leaves- to make food for the tree from sunlight.

Parts of a Tree



Garden plants- many plants are planted in gardens and parks to look or smell nice. These are often flowering plants e.g. tulips and sunflowers

Wild plants- not planted by humans. E.g. bluebells and snowdrops

Weeds- unwanted plants that grow in our gardens.

Maps can be drawings or models. They can help you find where you are and where you are going. They show **symbols** (pictures) for places such as car parks or places of worship like churches. They also have a **key**, which tells you what the symbols mean..



Maps can help you find your way using **directions**. You can use a **compass** to find out which direction you are facing. The compass points are: **north (N), east (E), south (S) and west (W).**
