Scholarship objectives:

The scholarship is named after Anthony Richardson who is a long-term supporter of our organ and was responsible for initiating the major restoration of our organ in 2012-13.

This is an exciting opportunity for a music student or graduate with specialist organ training to apply for Union Chapel's unique Organ Scholarship, which is designed to support an individual in their professional development and leadership skills within the organ field.

You will work alongside and gain experience from our Music Director and support her and the Organ Programme Coordinator in the production of our organ programme. You will be given a number of performance opportunities, including our recital series and teaching/workshop leading working with primary and secondary schools, university students and adults.

A commitment of 12 hours per month (with the majority of hours on Wednesdays) is required and any additional hours will be paid at a fixed rate. We are looking for a confident scholar who will help to engage new diverse audiences including schools and the public of all backgrounds including encouraging participation from harder to reach groups and individuals.













Main Requirements

- To commit 12 hours per month to various duties agreed with the Music Director.
- To support the Music Director in the production of the organ programme. With guidance and support you will be responsible for leading our traditional recital series.
- The opportunity to perform one new work at each recital. We would like to pull works from the Union Chapel archive where possible.
- To assist in our organ workshops for schools and work closely with our Organ Programme Coordinator on developing new relationships with schools and local groups who have not yet participated.
- Take part in our university composition/performance series starting in October 2025.
- Lead some of our heritage tours, which includes demonstrating the organ to large groups.

- Gain experience of all aspects of Union Chapel including fundraising, production and marketing by shadowing the relevant team members.
- Assist our Marketing Manager in audience development for our organ concert programme.
- To be an enthusiastic ambassador for the Chapel and our organ.

As a scholar at Union Chapel, you will also have access to set practice time on our Henry Willis Organ. Additional opportunities in professional development. Observe and attend appropriate meetings.

You must have a legal right to work in the UK

A DBS check will be required for this role.

Please apply with your CV and a cover letter (of no more than two pages), outlining:

- Your skills and experience to date, and how you would benefit from the scholarship.
- Why you'd like this opportunity of this Anthony Richardson Organ Scholarship with the Union Chapel.
- Your availability to start.
