One-way system introduced so departing and returning boats do so from separate piers. Wearing of PPE Boat hire operation is primarily an outdoor activity, a risk assessment has identified that employees engaged in the enhanced boat cleaning routine shall wear disposable aprons and gloves. Staff dealing with buoyancy aids will also wear disposable gloves. Staff administering first aid have access to disposable face visors.
