

Our successful work at HMP Wayland led to the commission to install a similar garden at HMP Swaleside. We have also shown prisoners how to prepare healthy, nutritious and low cost meals. The installation of a sensory garden in an infant's school in Norwich, and the first stage of a food producing garden in a middle school in Bury St Edmunds have provided the opportunity for young people to interact with nature and to start growing some of their own food. Our continued work at the Southwold Community & Wildlife Garden has meant that the site is now cleared of rubbish and much more accessible to the public.


