
KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS





NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE 2016

1. ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION

Utopia Group Limited is a company limited by shares incorporated in England and Wales under the Companies Act 2006.

The address of the registered office is given on page 1.

The principal activity of the company was that of an intermediate holding company.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 (FRS 102) issued by the Financial Reporting Council.

Following the company's adoption of FRS 102, the 2015 comparative information in the financial statements have been restated and re-presented under FRS 102. The adoption of FRS 102 has resulted in:

- no movement in the profit or loss for the year end 30th June 2015 from UK GAAP to FRS 102;
- no movement in the total equity under UK GAAP at 1st July 2014 and 30th June 2015 under FRS 102; and
- no movement in the balance sheet as at 1st July 2014 and as at 30th June 2015.

The functional currency of Utopia Group Limited is considered to be pounds sterling because that is the currency of the primary economic environment in which the company operates.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The company was dormant throughout the current year and previous year.

Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland":

- the requirements of Section 4 Statement of Financial Position paragraph 4.12(a)(iv);
- the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows;
- the requirement of Section 3 Financial Statement Presentation paragraph 3.17(d);
- the requirement of Section 33 Related Party Disclosures paragraph 33.7.

Preparation of consolidated financial statements

The financial statements contain information about Utopia Group Limited as an individual company and do not contain consolidated financial information as the parent of a group. The company is exempt under Section 400 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirements to prepare consolidated financial statements as it and its subsidiary undertaking are included by full consolidation in the consolidated financial statements of its parent, Utopia Bathroom Group Limited, a company registered in England and Wales.

Related party exemption

The company has taken advantage of exemption, under the terms of Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland', not to disclose related party transactions with wholly owned subsidiaries within the group.

2. **ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued**

Corporation tax and deferred taxation

UK corporation tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date, where such transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax assets are regarded as recoverable and therefore recognised only when, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits against which to recover carried forward tax losses and from which the future reversal of underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured at an average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is provided in respect of all timing differences which have arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date except as otherwise required by FRS 102 and is measured on a non-discounted basis.

Fixed asset investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at cost less any provision for impairment.

Significant judgements and estimates

In the application of the group's accounting policies, which are described above, the directors are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates. Future results could differ due to changes in these estimates and the difference between the actual result and the estimates are recognised in the period in which the results are known / materialise.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

3. **STAFF COSTS**

There were no staff costs for the year ended 30th June 2016 nor for the year ended 30th June 2015.

4. **DIRECTORS' EMOLUMENTS**

The directors are also directors of Utopia Furniture Limited, another company in the group, and their emoluments are included in the financial statements of that company. The remuneration of the directors is paid by the related parties and their services to the company are primarily of a non-executive nature and their emoluments are deemed to be wholly attributable to their services to the related parties. The related parties have not charged any amounts to the company in respect of their services in either the current or previous years.

Information regarding the directors' total remuneration for the group can be found in the consolidated financial statements of Utopia Bathroom Group Limited.

5. **OPERATING PROFIT**

The auditors remuneration has been borne by an associated group company for both the current and previous years and is not recharged. Information regarding the auditors' total remuneration for auditing the group can be found in the consolidated financial statements of Utopia Bathroom Group Limited.

13. ULTIMATE PARENT COMPANY

The immediate and ultimate parent undertaking is Utopia Bathroom Group Limited, a company registered in England and Wales, which heads the largest and smallest group to consolidate the financial statements of the company. Copies of the consolidated group financial statements, which include the company, are available from the Company Secretary at Utopia House, Springvale Avenue, Springvale Business Park, Bilston, Wolverhampton, WV14 0QL.

14. CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

As a result of the Group refinancing that took place in July 2009, the company guarantees related party loans made by Halcon Properties Limited to the ultimate parent company Utopia Bathroom Group Limited. The balance of these borrowings at 30th June 2016 amounted to £2,539,000 (2015 - £3,434,000).

The company has provided a multi-lateral guarantee over all monies owed by the company and its subsidiaries to HSBC, secured by way of fixed and floating charges over the assets and undertakings of the company. At the year end Utopia Furniture Ltd owed £616,000 (2015 - £759,000) to HSBC.
