THE DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2009

The directors present their report with the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2009. This report has been prepared in accordance with the special provisions relating to small companies under section 415A of the Companies Act 2006.

BUSINESS REVIEW AND PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Canary Wharf Group plc and its ultimate parent undertaking is Songbird Estates plc.

The principal activity of the company is to act as an investment holding company.

As shown in the company's profit and loss account, the company's profit after tax for the year was £1,192,711 (2008 £5,058,809).

The balance sheet shows the company's financial position at the year end and indicates that net assets were £1,192,712 (2008 £5,058,811). Details of amounts owed to group companies are shown in Note 7.

There have been no significant events since the balance sheet date.

DIVIDENDS AND RESERVES

The profit and loss account for the year ended 31 December 2009 is set out on page 6. Dividends of £5,058,810 (2008 £4,898,366) have been paid during the year and the retained loss of £3,866,099 (2008 profit of £160,443) has been transferred from reserves.

GOING CONCERN

The company's business activities, together with the factors likely to affect its future development, performance and position, are set out in this Directors' Report. The finances of the company and its liquidity position and borrowings are, where appropriate, also described in this report.

The company is in a net asset position at the year end. In addition, as a member of the Canary Wharf Group, the company has access to considerable resources.

Having made the requisite enquiries, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the company will have adequate resources to continue its operations for the foreseeable future. Accordingly they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2009

1. PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A summary of the principal accounting policies of the company, all of which have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year, is set out below

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards. The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis as described in the Directors' Report

In accordance with the provisions of FRS 1 (Revised) the company is exempt from the requirements to prepare a cash flow statement, as it is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Canary Wharf Group plc, which has prepared a consolidated cash flow statement

Income from investments

Investment income comprises dividends paid by subsidiary undertakings during the accounting period

Dividends

Dividend distributions to the company's shareholders are recognised in the financial statements in the period in which the dividends are paid or approved by the company's shareholders

Investments

Investments in subsidiaries are stated at cost less any provision for impairment

Trade and other debtors

Debtors are recognised initially at fair value. A provision for impairment is established where there is objective evidence that the company will not be able to collect all amounts due according to the original terms of the debtor concerned

Debt

Debt instruments are stated initially at the amount of the net proceeds. The finance costs of such debt instruments are allocated to periods over the term of the debt at a constant rate on the carrying amount. The carrying amount is increased by the finance cost in respect of the reporting period and reduced by payments made in respect of the debt of that period. Finance costs are charged to the profit and loss account

Taxation

Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid or recovered using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. The company is part of a UK group for group relief purposes and accordingly may take advantage of the group relief provisions whereby current taxable profits can be offset by current tax losses arising in other companies in that group. The group's policy is that no payment will be made for tax losses surrendered under the group relief provisions

The company has invested in all of the redeemable preference shares issued by its fellow subsidiary undertaking, CWE SPVg Limited, a company registered in England and Wales. The principal activity of this company is property investment.

During the year, the company received dividends of £5,058,810 (2008 £4,898,366)

At 31 December 2009, based on the financial statements of CWE SPVg Limited, the minimum expected future return from the shares was £39,692,711 (2008 £43,558,810). Accordingly, the provision for impairment has been increased by £3,866,099, which has been taken to the profit and loss account and treated as an exceptional item. This did not give rise to deferred tax.

In accordance with Section 400 of the Companies Act 2006, financial information is only presented in these financial statements about the company as an individual undertaking and not about its group because the company and its subsidiary undertakings are included in the consolidated financial statements of a larger group (Note 11).

The directors are of the opinion that the value of the investment is not less than the amount shown in the company's balance sheet.

11. ULTIMATE PARENT UNDERTAKING AND RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The company's immediate parent undertaking is CWE SPV HCo Limited

As at 31 December 2009, the smallest group of which the company is a member and for which group financial statements are drawn up is the consolidated financial statements of Canary Wharf Group plc. The largest group of which the company is a member for which group financial statements are drawn up is the consolidated financial statements of Songbird Estates plc, the ultimate parent undertaking and controlling party. The directors have taken advantage of the exemption in paragraph 3(c) of FRS 8 allowing the company not to disclose related party transactions with respect to other group companies.
