



1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

17Capital Scots GP II LLP is a partnership incorporated in Scotland under the Limited Liability Partnership Act. The address of the registered office is given on the contents page and the nature of the company's operations are set out in the members' report.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and the Republic of Ireland, the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice (2015) "Accounting by Limited Liability Partnerships".

Information on the impact of first-time adoption of FRS 102 is given in note 4.

The preparation of financial statements in compliance with FRS 102 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise judgment in applying the company's accounting policies. There were no significant judgements.

The following principal accounting policies have been applied:
