Respective responsibilities of directors and auditors



The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2005)

Going Concern

The accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis on the basis that the other group companies will continue to support the company providing additional funds as the company requires

Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable in respect of rental of properties during the year net of value added tax

Tangible Fixed Assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost (or valuation) less accumulated depreciation

Depreciation is provided to write off the cost (or valuation) of tangible fixed assets as follows

Plant & Machinery - 15% reducing balance

Investment Properties

Investment properties are revalued annually and included in the balance sheet at their open market value

Operating Leases

Costs in respect of operating leases are charged on a straight line basis over the lease term

Deferred Tax

Deferred taxation is provided for at anticipated tax rates on differences arising from the inclusion of items of income and expenditure in taxation computations in periods that differ from those in which they are included in the financial statements
