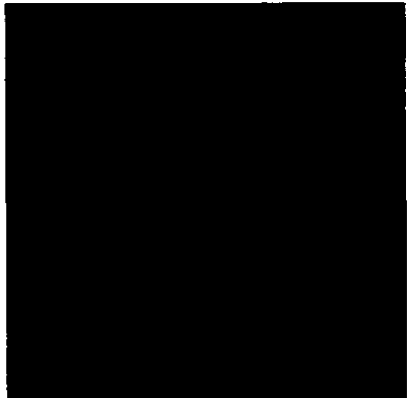
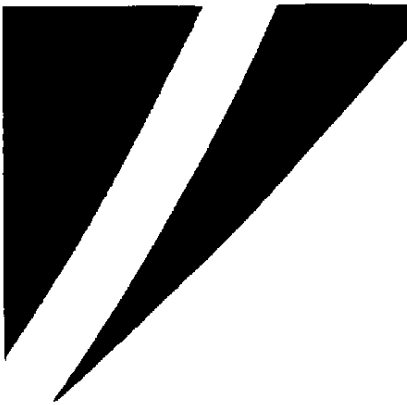
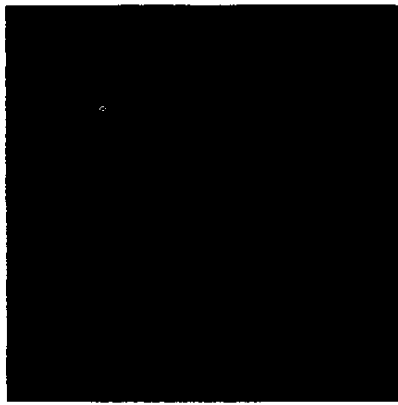


It is about seeking to create a single culture that embraces and accommodates differences without over-emphasising and reinforcing them.

To promote the concept of responsible citizenship, to instill a sense of personal pride in all our citizens of being British and create a real sense of collective Identity regardless of one's background.

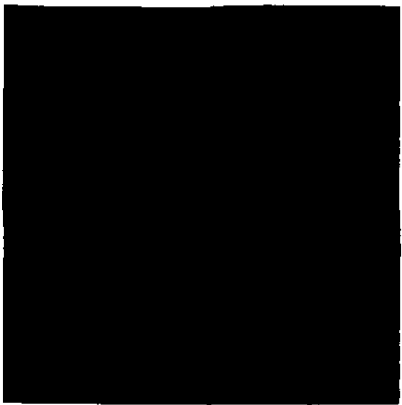

Fly with Pride ***Campaign - Sunday 11th August 2013***

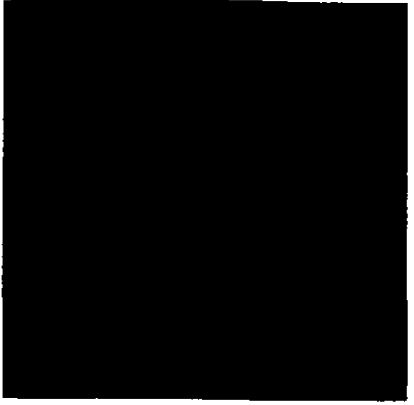
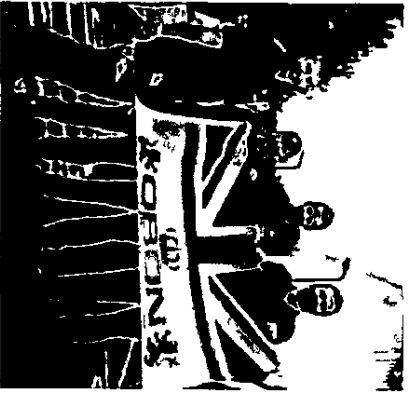
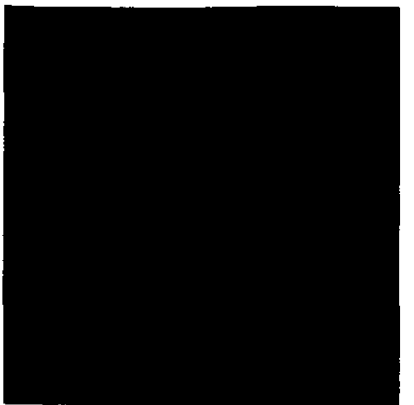

Determined to create a momentum that will perpetuate long into the future for the next generation of British people.

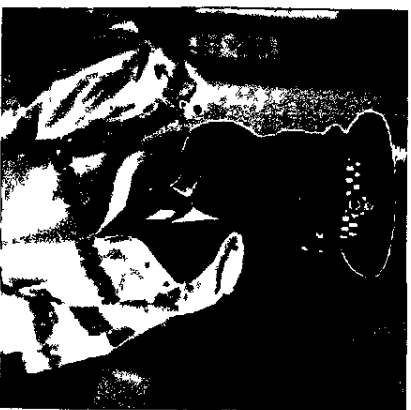
