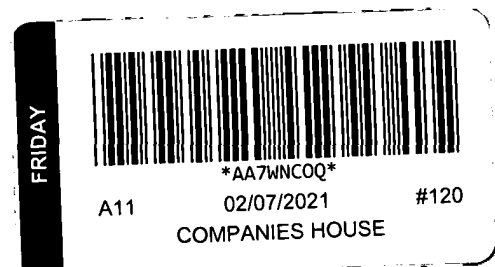

Strategic report

The directors present their strategic report for the year ended 30 June 2020.

The company is part of a group of undertakings whose main activity was magazine print and digital publishing. The business which related to this activity was sold in the prior period.

During the prior period, the company has changed the end of its accounting period from 31 December to 30 June. As a result, the comparative figures in these financial statements cover the eighteen months from 1 January 2018 to 30 June 2019.

The loss for the year amounted to £205.2m (2019: Profit - £9.1m) consisting of loan waivers of £205.6m (2019: £nil), profit on disposal of fixed asset investment of £0.2m (2019: £8.5m) and net interest receivable of £0.3m (2019: £0.6m). Net assets at year end were £12.1m (2019: £217.3m). Given that the company was a holding company, the directors do not believe there are any key performance indicators.

On 24 September 2019 the loan payable of £8.9m to Link House Magazines Limited, an affiliated company, was eliminated by deed of release.

On 2 October 2019 the investment in Sapphire Topco Ltd was sold for £0.2m

On 2 October 2019 the company received an amount of £3.4m as settlement of the escrow account that was set up on disposal of TI Media Limited.


On 2 March 2020 the company offset the loan payable to TI UK Publishing Holdings Limited of £106.7 with the loan receivable from the same company of £114m. On 3 March 2020 the remaining balance of £7.3m was eliminated by deed of release.

On 2 March 2020 the loan of £207.3m receivable from TI Magazines (UK) Limited was eliminated by deed of release.

The directors are not expecting any significant impact as a result of the COVID 19 pandemic as the companies assets and liabilities consist of inter-company loans.

The business risks facing the company are the same as those facing its ultimate parent company Meredith Corporation. A detailed description of these risks is set out in Meredith Corporation's 10-K Annual Report filing which is available online at the Meredith Corporation investor relations site: www.meredith.com.


Going concern

Statement of directors' responsibilities

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of TI Magazines Holdings Limited for the year ended 30 June 2020 which comprise the Income Statement, the Statement of Comprehensive Income, the Statement of Financial Position, the Statement of Changes in Equity and the related notes 1 to 13, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards including FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK" (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

In our opinion, the financial statements:

- give a true and fair view of the company's affairs as at 30 June 2020 and of its loss for the year then ended;

1 Accounting policies

Statement of compliance

TI Magazines Holdings Limited is a limited liability company incorporated in England. The registered office is 6th Floor, 60 Gracechurch Street, London, England, EC3V 0HR.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 (FRS 102), a Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland and with the Companies Act 2006.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards.

The financial statements are presented for the company as an individual undertaking. The company is not required to prepare group financial statements under section 400 of the Companies Act 2006 because its parent undertaking is established under the law of a member State of the European Union.

Under the provisions of FRS 102 section 1.12(b), the company has elected to make use of the exemption from the requirement to present a cash flow statement. The company is a qualifying entity because its ultimate parent company, Meredith Corporation, which is incorporated in the United States of America has prepared consolidated financial statements that include TI Magazines Holdings Limited which are publicly available.

Meredith Corporation, the company's ultimate parent company, has confirmed that, if required, it will provide financial support to the company during the year following the approval of the accounts. The directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future thus they consider that it is appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis.

The financial statements have been prepared in pounds sterling, which is the functional currency of the company and are rounded to the nearest £'000.

Judgements and estimates

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported for assets and liabilities as at the balance sheet date and the amounts reported for revenues and expenses during the year. The nature of estimation means that actual outcomes could differ from those estimates. The following judgements have had the most significant effect on amounts recognised in the financial statements.

Taxation

The company establishes provisions based on reasonable estimates for possible consequences of audits by the tax authorities. The amount of such provisions is based upon various factors such as experience with previous tax audits and differing interpretations of tax regulations by the company and the responsible tax authority.

Dividends

Dividends are recognised when the company's right to receive payment is established.

1 Accounting policies (continued)**Financial instruments**

The financial assets and liabilities held by the company are basic financial instruments and were initially recognised at the transaction price. Subsequent to initial recognition, they are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method. Debt instruments that are payable within one year are measured at the undiscounted amount of the cash or other consideration expected to be paid, net of impairment.

2 Directors and employees

The directors did not receive any emoluments for their qualifying services as directors of the company (2019: £nil).

The company had no other employees during the year (2019: nil).

3 Auditor's remuneration
