Notes to the abbreviated financial statements for the period ended 30 June 2012

1 Accounting policies

Going concern

The company has a healthy bank balance and no liquidity issues. The directors consider that the company's working capital funds are sufficient to meet its obligations through the initial development cycle and therefore consider it appropriate to prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis.

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the historical cost basis of accounting and have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

The financial statements do not include a cash flow statement because the company, as a small reporting entity, is exempt from the requirements to prepare such a statement under the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

Depreciation of tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the full cost or valuation less estimated residual value of each asset over its estimated useful life. The principal rates in use are:

Equipment, fixtures and fittings

20 - 33% on cost

Computer equipment

33% on cost

Intangible assets

Intangible fixed assets comprise licence exclusivity costs, intellectual property and goodwill, representing the excess of the amount paid over the value of intellectual property acquired. These are shown in the financial statements at amortised cost.

Intangible assets are amortised to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the following periods:

Licence exclusivity

over the period of the exclusivity agreement

Intellectual property

20 years

Goodwill

20 years

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is provided in respect of the tax effect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

A deferred tax asset is regarded as recoverable and therefore recognised only when, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis, at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred government grants

Government grants in respect of capital expenditure are treated as deferred income and are credited to the profit and loss account over the estimated useful life of the assets to which they relate.

Revenue grants are credited to the profit and loss account in the period in which the related costs are incurred.

Foreign currency translation

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into Sterling at the rates ruling at the period-end. Gains and losses arising are dealt with in the profit and loss account.

Hire purchase and lease transactions

Rentals under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account as they fall due.

2 Taxation on loss on ordinary activities

There is no current tax charge due to losses incurred during the period.

Factors that may affect future tax charges

At 30 June 2012 the company had accumulated tax losses of approximately £670,000 available to carry forward against future trading profits.
