1. Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

Turnover

The turnover shown in the Profit and Loss Account represents amounts earned during the year.

In respect of long-term contracts and contracts for on-going services, turnover represents the value of work done in the year, including estimates of amounts not invoiced. Turnover in respect of long-term contracts and contracts for on-going services is recognised by reference to the stage of completion.

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Computer Equipment - over 3 years

Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profits on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Deferred taxation

The accounting policy in respect of deferred tax reflects the requirements of FRSSE 2008.

Deferred tax is provided on the liability method to take account of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for accounts purposes and the treatment for tax purposes. Tax deferred is accounted for in respect of all material timing differences. Deferred tax assets are only recognised to the extent that they are regarded as recoverable.

- curated and produced two weekend long festivals in Glasgow focusing on the experimental music and visual arts, which included screenings, performances, talks, workshops, commissions and walks; employing - and exposing local audiences and communities to - artists from Scotland and the wider UK, as well as internationally.
- managed a joint educational project with Youth Music Initiative and community mental health charity Art Angel in Dundee
- managed and participated in a joint educational project with Youth Music Initiative and migrant rights and welfare charity UNITY which engaged with the refugee community of Glasgow - frequently ignored and disenfranchised - empowering them to express their social position through the development of an artistic practice.

- began the construction of a new website, which will contain a Research and Development section, where our stakeholders will be invited to communicate, educate, learn and discuss.
