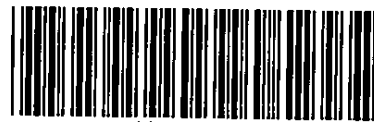

Reorganisation of the Trustee Board took place to ensure the long term success of the working of the Charity

Development of UK Head Office

- Continuation of employment of part time administrator
- The contract terms of previous NVQ volunteers ended in January 2011
- Another Volunteer joined WYCE to assist with administration for 6 months
- WYCE also employed another part-time employee in order to organise fund-raising events Due to lack of funds we had to end this contract in September 2011
- WYCE's new web-site was completed in 2011 – www.wyce.org.uk

Fundraising/Publicity

- Revenue continues to be raised through monthly sponsors, donations and sponsored events
- Extension of personnel involved in fundraising, throughout the UK
- Continuation of the development of GAMBO Project – project for use in schools within UK (DVD and programme of activities)
- Revenue from volunteers staying at the WYCE lodge in Madina Salaam
- Large donation helped to develop Income-generating initiatives and opportunities in WYCE-Gambia
- The new donors introduced WYCE to a professional Consultant in order to professionalise the WYCE Board This Consultant also introduced a professional Fund-raiser and a Marketing specialist to our organisation, so work has also been done with them throughout the latter quarter of 2011
- Links for WYCE have been established on more social networking sites e.g. Facebook, Twitter etc
- A new 'WYCE Ladies Inner Circle' was formed in order to organise fund-raising events throughout the year
- Fund-raising events were held e.g. Snowdon Climb, WYCE Re-union etc

**Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of

I report on the accounts of the company for the year ended 31 December 2011, which are set out on pages 5 to 15

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

Trustees' Report

- More emphasis has been put into links with Inner Wheels, Rotary Clubs etc in order to gain support and awareness
- Links were made with intermediate technology building equipment manufacturer which provided suitable equipment to enable income-generating activities within the project in Gambia

Developing links between UK and USA

Despite huge efforts both from WYCE-UK and the proposed WYCE-USA, it became very obvious that setting up another arm of WYCE in Chicago was going to prove to be virtually impossible. After relentless efforts, it was regrettably agreed to accept defeat.

A joint audit of Skills and evaluation of all aspects of the WYCE Project was undertaken by Trustees and the Gambia Management Team in November 2011. Action Plans were devised for 2011 – 2015 in order to plan for long-term self-sustainability.

Links have been made through Medical Universities etc.

Links have been created through 'Christ the King' Football club in Coventry in order to develop a Zonal Football Tournament and Training Scheme within the project village of Madina Salaam and its environs.

Developing links between Gambia and UK

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
Development of project in The Gambia



1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005)', issued in March 2005, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) and the Companies Act 2006

Fund accounting policy

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees' discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the charity

Further details of each fund are disclosed in note 16

Incoming resources

Donations are recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Incoming resources from tax reclaims are included in the statement of financial activities at the same time as the gift to which they relate

Shop income and income derived from events is recognised as earned (that is, as the related goods or services are provided)

Resources expended

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income and the costs of trading for fundraising purposes

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them

Support costs

Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of resources, for example, allocating property costs by floor areas, or per capita, staff costs by the time spent and other costs by their usage

Fixed assets

Individual fixed assets costing £0 or more are initially recorded at cost

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on tangible fixed assets so as to write off the cost or valuation, less any estimated residual value, over their expected useful economic life as follows

Plant and machinery	50% straightline basis
Office Equipment	25% reducing balance basis
