The company is involved in technology research & training, late stage dementia care support in specialist units and care homes and supporting those living with earlier stage dementia in a residential setting.

In this year we completed research working with our partners at The University of Stirling and Brain Injury Rehabilitation Trust (BIRT). This research was productive and gave us strong academic evidence in using heart rate and other measurements from wearables to help detect problems in dementia such as agitation, aggression, distress, agitation, delusions etc.

We also worked with several schools and educators as part of programs with STEM, CISO Little Big Awards, The Micro:bit Foundation and Apps for Good to help young people interested in technology think about social care and to help young carers think about using technology to help them and their loved ones.

Over the year we have also worked very closely with the staff at NHS Maple Villa a leading Scottish specialist NHS Dementia Unit in West Lothian so that the care teams and patients and families interested in using assistive care technologies can be supported. We have helped staff and patients use dozens of off-the-shelf wearable and room sensor products that have helped the team with things such as detect pain, pool sleep, agitation and generally managing environmental conditions such as temperature/humidity, Co2 and noise.

We have also attended many public events and helped people choose technology for a residential setting. This includes contributing to the design and development of the <a href="http://dementiacircle.org/">http://dementiacircle.org/</a> from Alzheimer Scotland. We have also been working with one developers of new Fit Homes in Scotland, the Albyn Housing Society, helping to ensure that the technologies which can benefit those with dementia are included in many new homes.

The company has been working with several academics and clinical specialist at the University of Stirling, BIRT and NHS Lothian. The company is aware that the technologies are new and innovative, and that strong academic evidence and clinical efficacy will help give those with dementia and their care givers the confidence to use them most effectively.

We ask all those we meet with dementia and their care givers what their challenges are. This research has helped us identify dozens of key challenges. We have worked closely with those with dementia and their care givers on technologies that can help with these key challenges. We worked with users to design hundreds or 'recipes' which are personalized technology adaptions to help with most of these challenges. We encourage new people we work with to look at the 'recipes' from previous people we worked with try to adapt an approach with a good track record wherever possible rather than create something completely new each time.
