6 Guidance

- a. The attached template for dormant company accounts is only suitable for those companies limited by shares which have never traded and where the only transaction entered into the accounting records of the company is the issue of subscriber shares.
- b. Shares may be fully paid, partly paid or unpaid: Any paid element should be shown as "Cash at Bank and in hand", Any unpaid element shown as "Called up share capital not paid".
- c. Dormant companies acting as an agent for any person must state that they have so acted in Section 3.
- d. A fee or penalty raised on the company for the payment of an annual return fee, change of name fee, reregistration fee, or late filing penalty may be omitted from the company records and this DCA—if the payment was made by a third party without any right of reimbursement.
- e. The company directors are responsible for preparing and filing accounts at Companies House that comply with the requirements of the Companies Act and failure to do so may result in prosecution. Should you have any doubt about the company's entitlement to file dormant accounts, or the preparation of those accounts, you should seek professional advice.
- f. This guidance only advises on the preparation of abbreviated dormant accounts which can be filed at Companies House. It does not advise on the preparation of full accounts for the members.

The company helps people with dementia and other cognitive impairments with a particular emphasis on enabling people to self-manage and self-design systems using assistive technology.

They also help carers by providing decision support information and real-time warnings and alarms preceding and during dangerous or upsetting events. For the local authority these systems also have many benefits delaying expensive care home admission and unplanned hospital visits as a result of falls or other accidents. They also help improve life general quality for citizens particularly for the users and carers involved directly.

We have benefited the community in the following ways:

- We have actively promoted and educated people to use assistive technologies at a number of public and community events
- We been working on a pilot testing services we plan to offer with the University of Stirling and a charity (BIRT)
- Many people have been provided advise about suitable assisted technologies for dementia and other cognitive impairments

We have met with families and several local authorities' involved in dementia care needs and asked what services we can offer to help them. Our services have user-design and self-management at their core.

We are focused on helping people self-management and self-design assisted living solutions for dementia and have been developing services to help provide ongoing support to our target groups. We helped train some users to use a low cost set of tools to design a system of sensors to support their needs.

We are working on good example projects and demonstrations to help inspire more people use assistive technology to help self-manage their condition and are adapting and refining this offering based on feedback.
