The number of those that failed, broken down by authority and year.

## Response

The FSA is the Central Competent Authority for food safety and has a statutory function to protect public health and consumers' other interests in relation to food and drink. However, the day to day responsibility for delivery of controls rests with local authorities and they decide upon their local sampling priorities, conduct the sampling, arrange for relevant testing and carry out appropriate enforcement activity in relation to any unsatisfactory results. It is every LA's responsibility to ensure they are delivering official controls in food businesses and that appropriate resources are allocated, including sampling where appropriate.

In response to your request, the information has been extracted from the Food Surveillance System (UKFSS), a voluntary sampling database which is not used by all Local Authorities (LAs). Collation of sampling data, to analyse national trends, is further complicated by the fact it is not always recorded and reported in a consistent way and our ability to interrogate what is a sizeable dataset is reliant upon how information is coded. As a result, we are unable to collate a full picture of sampling activity and this has limited its value as comprehensive surveillance data from which firm conclusions about food risk or new and emerging threats could be drawn. To address these issues, the FSA is looking to modernise and standardise reporting of LA sampling to enable a more comprehensive dataset to be analysed.

Those LAs that do not use UKFSS report their sampling activity through the annual Local Authority Enforcement Monitoring System (LAEMS). This system only provides high level information on the total number of samples taken by each LA and does not provide details of the parameter tested or the sample results.

The FSA is also developing a new strategic surveillance approach which will give us more data and intelligence to boost public protection. This information will allow us to advise and support LAs to plan their own sampling and analysis to be more targeted and effective

LAs are responsible for developing and implementing their food sampling policy and programme for the year, which should take account of priorities set nationally.

While sampling is a key part of an LA's approach to delivering official controls, it is only one tool available to check compliance in this area, which include inspections, which would cover, checks on food handling practices in relation to allergenic ingredients, menu and description checks, physical checks of the products, including labels. As part of the inspection process, officers will consider if it is necessary to take a sample. This will result in LA sampling activity being targeted to areas of

concern rather than it being random sampling, and skew the results to produce a higher percentage of samples that are found to contain allergen in comparison to if the food samples taken were all random

Where samples are unsatisfactory, LAs are responsible for taking appropriate action. This may include removing the food from the market and advising the business on how to achieve compliance. In some instances, enforcement action such as prosecution or simple cautions may be appropriate. In addition to protecting the public this action also aims to prevent economic or other detriment and improve levels of compliance.

Details of the number of samples analysed for allergenic ingredients from our search of UKFSS are provided in the tables below. We sought to verify these results with all relevant LAs. Given that not all LAs responded and in light of the issues highlighted above, these results do not necessarily reflect the full extent of LA sampling for allergens and this would only be guaranteed by approaching each LA directly.
