

# Pounds Park Tree Design Consultation

Following a public consultation in June-July 2021, the tree planting design below has been created for Pounds Park through Central Park's Treescape for the Future project, part of the Green Minds programme. This tree planting design was created by Plymouth City Council Landscape Technician Apprentices who have developed it to complement Pounds Park and the existing trees planted here, while adding year round colour and interest, benefits for wildlife and some trees that are not found in Central Park already.

5 trees to complement existing trees here and benefit wildlife.  
Suggested trees: Queen Elizabeth Field Maple, Magnolia, Handkerchief, Red Sentinel Crab Apple, Bee Tree

**A2**  
3 trees to define seating area, add shade and provide autumn and spring colour.  
Suggested trees: Eastern Redbud, Persian Ironwood

4 trees create an area for reflection and provide year round colour.  
Suggested trees: Gold Rush, Japanese Maple 'Osakazuki', Winter Orange Lime, Japanese Snowbell

**A1**  
2 large trees to frame avenue and provide autumn colour.  
Suggested trees: Kentucky Coffee

**A4**  
1 tree on east side to frame avenue. Option to add a second tree on west side if space becomes available.  
Suggested trees: Monkey Puzzle



**A5**  
3 trees for year round colour and that benefit wildlife.  
Suggested trees: Wedding Cake, Strawberry

2 large trees add shade and interest.  
Suggested trees: White Oak, Kentucky Coffee
