
## 1. Introduction


Asset managers are increasingly being asked to tell institutional investors what % of their fund is constituted by "sustainable investments".




## 2. What is the definition of a "sustainable investment"?

The definition of "sustainable investments" is much debated, but your firm should note that investors are typically using EU regulatory definitions, and so you very much need to be aware of the key guidelines.

To position your firm on the safe side of the regulation, you should note the following:

 The EU Taxonomy defines an "environmentally sustainable" investment as one which contributes to at least one of 6 specified environmental objectives, and does no significant harm to any of those objectives.



• The broader term "sustainable investments" usually means the investor wants the SFDR definition applied.

This defines a sustainable investment as one where the PAIs have been considered, and also where a substantial contribution is made to at least one (and no significant harm is done to any) of the 12 environmental and social objectives set out in SFDR Article 2.17.

 Some argue that Article 2.17 cites these 12 objectives as examples and not requirements, but ESMA has since formally clarified that there must be no significant harm "to any of the objectives referred to in Article 2 point 17."

This means that those 12 objectives must be considered, as well as the mandatory 14 PAIs.

Additionally, an investment can only be considered "sustainable" if the
investee company follows "good governance practices, in particular with
respect to sound management structures, employee relations,
remuneration of staff and tax compliance".



So, if you are going to report back to investors on what % of a fund is "sustainable investments", you are going to have to do a lot of analysis on each of the fund's holdings, across *specific* E, S & G metrics.

## 3. What is a 'Sustainable Investment Audit' report?
