How to: Chair a meeting

As Consultants you are key to both standing up to discrimination and role modelling the behaviours we'd like to see across our organisation. For the second half of the session we'll consider human rights based care. Do we deliver it and how can we do better?

In order to effectively improve our processes we must first understand them, and the people that work them. In this session we will challenge you to think about systems and how you can use this knowledge in your own clinical area to drive improvement.

Realistic Medicine: What does it mean for you, your patients and your service?

Join us to have a wide-ranging discussion around the 6 tenets of Realistic Medicine namely (i) building a personalised approach to patient care; (ii) changing style to shared decision-making; (iii)





reducing harm and waste; (iv) tackling unwarranted variation in practice and outcomes; (v) managing risk better; (vi) becoming improvers and innovators in healthcare. We'll consider how these could/should influence our clinical practice and how we can best explain our decision-making to patients, families and colleagues.

Medical Leadership Academy- 'Feeling heard, feeling valued'

How do we ensure that we are inclusive in our leadership? How can we ensure that each member of our own team, and the teams we work with, is able to speak up? How can we act quickly and effectively challenge if behaviours are not inclusive? In this session we'll look at barriers to our team members being heard and we'll have some tools and resources to help you develop and contribute to an inclusive culture.
