

Victims' Services Grants 2015/16

Partner	Allocation 2015/16 (£)	Rationale
Cambridgeshire Constabulary – Victims' Hub	£446,682	This grant funds the Victims' Hub which supports victims to cope and recover from the crime or incident they have experienced. The Victim Care Co-ordinators provide emotional support to victims and depending on the need of the victim can support seamlessly through their criminal justice journey to court and beyond.
Shrievalty Trust	50,000	This trust works with police officers to provide a free service to victims of burglary aged 60 or more who live in the county. The trust has two security advisors who provide practical help, reassurance and peace of mind at a time when it is most needed, usually within 48 hours of the burglary.
Multi Agency Referral Unit – Independent Domestic Violence Advisor	41,000	This grant funds a Young Persons' IDVA for Cambridgeshire who provides specialist support to young victims of domestic abuse. The grant is made in line with the Police and Crime Priority 'Keeping people safe' which is contained within the Police and Crime Plan.
Migrant Support Worker	16,961	This post holder provides and co-ordinates emotional and practical support to migrant workers who are victims of exploitation.
SARC – Family Worker	51,500	This Family Worker based in the Sexual Assault Referral Centre (SARC) provides therapeutic support for the families for young victims of sexual abuse and give them the skills to effectively support their son or daughter with their experience.
Young People's Independent Sexual Violence Advisors	80,000	This grant funds two Young Persons' ISVAs for Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. They provide ongoing practical and emotional support to victims aged 0 – 19 years of rape or sexual abuse.
CPFT Mental Health Pathfinders Project	75,000	This grant funds Community Psychiatric Nurses to work in the Victims Hub and provide expertise, support and a referral capability for victims with mental health issues identifying pathways into treatment. They work with other professionals providing a holistic approach.
Cambridge City Council – RJ Panel	3,000	This grant supports the Cambridge City Council Neighbourhood Resolution Panel Initiative and links with the RJ Hub.
Ormiston Families Trust	9,900	This grant has been awarded to Ormiston Families to deliver three Cope and Recover Community Group Programmes (AVA) for those children / young people aged between 9-11 years old who have experienced domestic violence.

		The programme supports mothers but also puts a particular focus on supporting the children to recover and make positive future outcomes.
Embrace Child Victims of Crime	2,000	The charity uses this grant to provide practical support for young victims (under 18) of crime to cope and recover from the impact of the crime they have experienced.
Cambridge Rape Crisis	3,000	This grant is to enable the effective provision of emotional and practical support for victims of sexual violence. This grant is provided as a contribution to the funding of an ISVA Administrator post to ensure that the ISVA service has the best possible outcomes for survivors of sexual violence, for both those currently using the service and those waiting to access it.
Centre 33	2,500	This grant is to identify and support potential young victims of domestic abuse through the delivery of five Healthy Relationship Workshops at secondary schools in Cambridgeshire. The recipient schools will be identified in partnership with the Cambridgeshire Safer Communities Partnership Team.
YMCA Cambridgeshire & Peterborough	2,000	This grant ensures provision of time-limited accredited counselling for young victims of crime (9 – 18 years) to help them to cope and recover from the crime which has been committed against them.
Embrace CVOC	6,500	Provision of time-limited accredited counselling (minimum of six sessions) for young victims of crime (9 – 18 years) to help them to cope and recover from the crime which has been committed against them.
Cambridge Rape Crisis	9,500	This grant is to fund a specialist counselling provision for adult victims of sexual violence and whose needs are complex, dynamic and wide ranging. This service will address the emotional 'recover' element of a victim's journey, and in part provide a staged exit strategy from ISVA support.
Restorative Justice	100,957	Provision of a Multi-Agency Virtual Restorative Justice Hub to receive referrals.
