## HMIC Reports

### 1. Purpose

1.1 The purpose of this paper is to report to the Business Coordination Board (“the Board”) Cambridgeshire Constabulary’s (“the Constabulary”) response to Her Majesty’s Inspectorate of Constabulary’s (HMIC) recent reports on the following:

- Crime Data Integrity (Agenda Item 14.1);
- Crime Inspection (Agenda Item 14.2);
- Police Integrity and Corruption (Agenda Item 14.3); and
- Strategic Policing Requirement (Agenda Item 14.4).

1.2 This report and the minutes of the Board meeting will enable the Cambridgeshire Police and Crime Commissioner (“the Commissioner”) to fulfil his statutory duty under Section 55 of the Police Act 1996 to comment on the HMIC reports and send published comments to the Home Secretary, with a copy to HMIC.

### 2. Monitoring of HMIC Reports and Recommendations

2.1 The findings of HMIC reports continue to be reported to the Board as they are published, along with details of any recommendations made to the Constabulary.

2.2 The response to HMIC recommendations will be monitored by the Force Operational Review Panel, which will in turn report to the Force Performance Board, chaired by the Assistant Chief Constable.

2.3 HMIC recommendations from the four reports listed at 1.1 have been incorporated into appropriate action plans by business leads, who will be responsible for reporting back on the Constabulary’s response to these through the Operational Review Panel.

2.4 The Commissioner will continue to monitor and hold the Constabulary to account on these HMIC report areas through commissioning reports from the Constabulary on their progress against the respective action plans.

**3. Recommendation**

3.1 It is recommended that the Board notes the contents of this paper and those attached as Agenda Items 14.1 to 14.4.
