Two – PCC	<p>The Police and Crime Panel referred two complaints to the Independent Police Complaints Commission (IPCC), who referred the complaints back to the Panel as the matters did not warrant investigation.</p> <p>The Panel considered the response from the IPCC and determined that no further action should be taken against the Police and Crime Commissioner.
