Dear member of the public

I am writing in reply to your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, dated 26 March 2015.

The Freedom of Information Act 2000 (The Act) requires us to handle all requests in a manner that is blind to the identity of the requestor. Any information released in response to a request is regarded as being published, and therefore in the public domain without caveat.

You requested the following:

- 1) Does Cambridgeshire have a wildlife crime strategy (if not are there plans to do so)?
- 2) Does Cambridgeshire currently record wildlife crime and if so how many have there been over the past three years?
- 3) Does Cambridgeshire currently provide wildlife crime intelligence to the National Wildlife Crime Unit (if not are there plans to do so)?
- 4) How many wildlife crime officers does Cambridgeshire currently have, how many hours a week do they work directly on wildlife crime and are there plans to formalise this role if it hasn't been already?
- 5) Have you undertaken any additional activities since taking office to promote wildlife crime enforcement (please provide detail)?

Our response to your request is as follows:

I can advise that the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner does not hold the information requested.

However, Cambridgeshire Constabulary, which is a separate organisation and is treated as such under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, may hold this information.
