VIEWS FROM THE PUBLIC RAISED WITH THE ACTING POLICE AND CRIME COMMISSIONER

1. Purpose

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to enable the Acting Police and Crime Commissioner (the "Acting Commissioner"), in line with his remit, to listen to questions, issues and concerns of the public and communities, and in providing this local link between them and Cambridgeshire Constabulary (the "Constabulary"), bring these to the attention of the Chief Constable for him to respond to, given the operational nature of the questions.
- 1.2 Responses given by the Chief Constable will then be published on both the Office of the Police Commissioner's (OPCC) and the Constabulary's websites.

2. Recommendation

- 2.1 The Business Co-ordination Board (the "Board") is asked to note the report and the questions given.

3. Background

- 3.1 The Acting Commissioner undertakes a range of engagement activities with the public, communities, representative groups and elected members. The Acting Commissioner can also be contacted through the OPCC's email box, which on average per month receives 90-100 pieces of correspondence. Correspondence received can be wide ranging relating to the Acting Commissioner's broad role, including some of which are the views, concerns or questions relating to the Constabulary and operational policing.
- 3.2 As this report is a standing item at every monthly Board meeting, any key themes and trends arising from both the Acting Commissioner's engagement each month or the correspondence received will form the basis of this report.

4. Concerns and questions raised

- 4.1 The theme for this report is a result of correspondence received through the Acting Commissioner’s mailbox and relates to **compliance with Covid-19 regulations**, and whilst the concerns may relate to specific areas of the county, for the purposes of this thematic questioning, they have been generalised so this provides an opportunity for a county-wide response.
- 4.2 What action are police officers are taking with regards to issues of non-compliance
- 4.3 Are businesses, such as a car wash which are open, in breach of the regulations.
- 4.4 What action can be taken regarding skateparks which are open and attracting between 20 and 70 people with no social distancing in place.

5. Of Interest to the Public

- 5.1 Can the Chief Constable reassure the public as to the outcome of the national issue regarding the deletion of data on the Police National Computer?

6. Recommendation

- 6.1 The Board is asked to note the report and the questions given.
