

The story of Dundee Rep and Scottish Dance Theatre is one of its **people**: its artists, creatives, staff, participants and audiences.

Dundee Rep and Scottish Dance Theatre sits at the cultural heart of Dundee as a centre of **creative excellence**. The Organisation looks outwards, creating and delivering work for local, national and international audiences, with learning at the heart. "The Rep" recently celebrated its 80th anniversary in 2019, and is home to the Dundee Rep Ensemble, the only permanent full-time company of its kind in Scotland. Scottish Dance Theatre is one of the few full-time companies in the UK and is made up of a collective of inquisitive and versatile dancers who have come from all over the world to work and create in our home at Dundee Rep. Together these twin ensembles have created a number of award-winning productions, made in Dundee that tour nationally and internationally, establishing a reputation as one of the UK's leaders in theatre and dance production, carrying the Dundee brand far and wide.

Over the course of eight decades, Dundee Rep and Scottish Dance Theatre has been at the **heart** of performance in Scotland, and grown into a **world-class** organisation, with two artistic forces based in Dundee, touring to and reaching the rest of the world.

We use the arts to help transform lives, creating opportunities for people to experience art and culture that inspires, transforms, enriches and challenges. # Through the years...

### **April 2021**



### **REP STUDIOS**

We launched REP STUDIOS in April 2021 – our new digital platform showcasing theatre, dance and music which celebrates Dundee's distinctive cultural voice within a wider world. REP STUDIOS provided employment for 84 Scottish-based freelancers over 5 months and builds on last year's digital output which employed 55 freelance artists and creatives.

REP STUDIOS further cements Dundee Rep and Scottish Dance Theatre's identity as one creative organisation with a strong commitment to public service. Designed to reach and engage wider audiences thanks to its digital and accessible nature. This was only made possible through the support from our core funding partners Creative Scotland and Dundee City Council together with the support of the Scottish Government through the Performing Arts Venues Relief Fund.





### Thin h/as h/air (Rep Studios Live Stream)

Scottish Dance Theatre celebrated International Dance Day in style with the livestream on REP STUDIOS of *Thin h/as h/air* by company member and choreographer **Pauline Torzuoli**. The solo was made available for free on REP STUDIOS for an entire year, giving access to audiences across Scotland and beyond to the work of Scottish Dance Theatre and showcasing our in-house choreographic talent. An Audio Described version of the film was also made available for visually-impaired audiences.

### **SMILE** On-Demand

The *Jim McLean Story* returned in a brand-new digital version of the show we premiered pre-pandemic back in February 2020. The production reached 756 households from Hong Kong to Washington to France to Orkney during its month-long run. We were delighted to share the *Jim McLean Story* with our audiences from across the world.



### **Green Achievement**

We recycled 37 PCs and assorted equipment to a recycling company that refurbs them or uses them for spares to make working PCs for other countries.



### **May 2021**

### This is for you, Dundee festival

A natural continuation from *Where are you*, *Dundee?* which was created by and for the people of Dundee, *This is for you*, *Dundee* presented new work created by 26 freelance artists and creatives engaging with the people of Dundee in celebration of their resilience during an extremely challenging year and exploring the transformative power of performing arts. As part of this



mini-festival, six special projects took place in the audio and digital spheres. Crossing art forms and exploring a wide range of themes, This is for you, Dundee offered something for people of all ages, with accessibility at its core and aspects of the festival, using non-verbal storytelling and dance with all projects captioned.

### This is is for you, Dundee (Schools)

This is For You Dundee (Schools) connected six artists with six schools across Dundee to deliver creative experiences supporting the health and well-being of children and young people. Six artists worked with two secondary schools and four primary schools in the Hilltown and Whitfield areas of Dundee over 8 months. Artists worked with children and young people from Primary 3 to S5 in mainstream and ASN classes to codesign and develop their projects across multiple artforms including drama, dance, and music. In addition, local artist and pop star Be Charlotte worked across all six schools to deliver a programme of songwriting workshops. 780 children and young people participated in the programme that was funded by Creative Scotland through the Youth Arts Access Fund.

### storage for future sunsets

Choreographer **J Neve Harrington** was invited to develop a new version of *storage for future sunsets* for touring in galleries and other indoor spaces. Originally premiered at V&A Dundee in 2019, this new cross-art form durational performance was shared through a series of live streams and with socially distanced audiences in The Weaving Shed, celebrating the industrial heritage of the city of Dundee.



### **May 2021**



### **AREA OF A CIRCLE** (live and live-streamed)

AREA OF A CIRCLE was a night of music and film performed on the Dundee Rep stage and live-streamed to a digital audience for one night only. 2015 Scottish Album of the Year Awardwinner Kathryn Joseph hosted the event and was joined on stage by fellow Dundee musicians Su Shaw (SHHE), Andrew Wasylyk, and Sion Parkinson.

Through film footage of Dundee and interviews with the artists, Artistic Director **Andrew Panton** and Associate Director **Jess Thorpe** offered audiences real insight into the recent lives of Kathryn and her friends during an unprecedented time for these creative artists. It was an evening of songs, stories, conversation, and a chance to discuss the influence of Dundee on the creative process and celebrate the return of live music.





### **3M MIXTAPE**

Delivering on our strategy of bringing music events to the fore and continuing our work with freelance artists, **Dawn Sievewright** (*Our Ladies of Perpetual Succour, Glasgow Girls*) and **John McLarnon** (*My Left Right Foot, Local Hero*) have collaborated with Rep Artistic Director **Andrew Panton** to present *3M MIXTAPE* (*part one*).

This special lockdown project forged a unique creative connection as it brought together incredible and diverse Scottish music talents to collaborate on a variety of duets. Filmed live and shot across different locations throughout Scotland that have changed their significance during lockdown, artists included Reuben Joseph, Eleanor Kane, Christina Modestou, Sally Clay, and Martin Quinn.

3M MIXTAPE blended original music and covers from a wide range of music genres, and features guest appearances from some of the original artists including **Boy George**.



# **Green Achievement**

We applied to head up a Climate Beacon and were successful. We found out we will be heading up 1 of 7 beacons in partnership with V&A, James Hutton Institute, Abertay University, and many more supported by Creative Carbon Scotland.



### **June 2021**



### **Dramatherapy**

Our Dramatherapy service offers a unique form of creative psychotherapy that utilises drama and theatre processes that can help build confidence and self-esteem, address communication problems, promote a sense of self-worth, and encourage involvement, expression, and connection with others.

Our Adult Dramatherapy service, funded by Dundee Heath and Social Care Partnership ran digitally and inperson following COVID 19 guidance and we saw an increase in referrals as the country moved back to inperson work. We were also able to offer an online process group to DRSDT employees each week to support them over the period of lockdown. We were delighted to be able to reinstate our young people's Dramatherapy Service in June 2021 funded by Dundee City Council Community Mental Heath and Wellbeing Fund. We have appointed two new Drama Therapists to our team and have seen a high demand for this service.



### Digital Buzz (Digital) Life and Tim

The *Digital Buzz Festival* was a week-long programme of work featuring performances created by Dundee Rep and Scottish Dance Theatre's community of weekly classes and groups. Due to the Covid 19 pandemic all of these groups had been meeting with teaching artists on-line and Digital Buzz was a way to celebrate their creativity and give them a platform to share work.

The festival featured 16 performances from classes and groups, an afternoon of new dance work by emerging dance artists, scratch performances from students at Dundee and Angus College and an open mic night hosted by Dundee recording artist **Be Charlotte**.



### **Life and Times (live-streamed)**

June saw the premiere of the first major creation of **Joan Clevillé** as Artistic Director of Scottish Dance Theatre. Celebrating the return of the full company to the stage of Dundee Rep, *The Life and Times* was created specifically for the camera, taking audiences on a cinematic and surreal dance journey, filmed in one 60min continuous shot by digital artist **Tao-Anas Le Thanh**. Performed and streamed live, the work was seen by audiences in ten countries, including Germany, Italy, Sweden, Brazil, and Japan.

### **July 2021**



### **Resonate Dance Company**

A project funded by the Life Changes Trust. The company consisted of a small group of care-experienced young people from Dundee and Angus with a passion for Dance. The group was established and led by **Abbey Adams** and in January 2020, they worked together through lockdown and social distancing restrictions both digitally and in person in line with Covid-19 guidance. The project culminated with a dance performance on the Rep stage called *When The Lights Go On* streamed for a live audience in July 2021. In October 2021 Dundee Rep and Scottish Dance Theatre hosted a Symposium that brought together other care-experienced young people from across Scotland to speak about the flagship arts projects they take part in.



### these bones, this flesh, this skin awards

Scottish Dance Theatre's collaboration with **Scottish Ensemble**, *these bones, this flesh, this skin* received not one but two awards recognising its value in the field of digital arts. The piece, born through the collaboration of composer **Martin Suckling**, choreographer **Joan Clevillé** and digital artist **Genevieve Reeves** in 2020 won the Award for Installation/Sound Art/Electroacoustic New Work at the **Scottish Awards for New Music 2021** and the international Innovation Award at **Classical:NEXT Awards 2021**.

August 2021

### **RE-OPENING**

During the time our auditorium was closed to the public to August 2021, we were hugely proud to have given work to **141 freelancers**, worked with over **500 participants** in community engagements, created **11 brand new full scale digital productions**, and presented **215 new digital performances**.





### Improvement works

During the pandemic, our theatre may have been dark, but the building was full of activity as we made a number of significant improvements.

Over the course of our building closure, we completed an overhaul of our IT systems – a challenge as many of our staff were continuing to work from home and depended on remote access to files. During these works our building's network cabling was completely replaced and expanded, bringing us up to a modern standard and able to carry 10 times more data than previously. Making the move from an in-house server to the Cloud gives our staff greater flexibility, and makes our organisation more robust as we move forward.

In our Front of House spaces, we installed new energy-efficient lighting with more control and flexibility over individual lamps, meaning we can save energy and adjust the ambiance to suit different occasions. In our restaurant, we brought fresh colours to the walls and installed new banquette seating to give diners more comfort. A new carpet and stair lighting brought a fresh feeling to our 455-seat auditorium. Our IT system upgrade included improvements to our building's Wi-Fi coverage, giving us the capacity to handle an almost unlimited number of devices, and an enhanced experience for audiences and staff.

This combination of front-facing and back-of-house work, completed by our dedicated staff and trusted partners, enabled Dundee Rep and Scottish Dance Theatre to work with confidence and agility as we reopened the theatre to audiences in person. We would like to say a special thank you to Adapt and Thrive and Digital Boost whose support helped make all these improvements happen.

### 合[Hé]

Three years after Scottish Dance Theatre's last tour to Asia, the company was delighted to reconnect with fans in China through 合[Hé], a short film created in collaboration by Artistic Director **Joan Clevillé** and Chinese choreographer **Yabin Wang**. 合[Hé] received its digital premiere at the China Contemporary Dance Biennale in August 21, organised by Shanghai International Dance Center Theater. Taking inspiration from the five phases of Wuxing in Chinese traditional philosophy (Fire, Water, Wood, Metal and Earth), the dancers of Yabin Studio and Scottish Dance Theatre interact with natural and urban environments, building intangible bridges across dance disciplines and the landscapes of Dundee and Beijing, Scotland and China.





### **Islander (Eden Court/REP STUDIOS)**

In August, we collaborated with **Eden Court Highlands** to present a filmed reimagining of *ISLANDER*. Based on the original stage show and produced in association with Helen Milne Productions, it streamed to 226 households from across the world. It was the winner of **Musical Theatre Review's Best Musical Award** – Edinburgh Fringe 2019 and this critically-acclaimed environmental show continued its success with an off-West End and Broadway run and a BBC Radio 4 adaptation.

### September 2021



### **Engage Classes**

In September 2021 we were delighted to welcome weekly classes and groups back into the theatre for in-person creative sessions. At this time we added new sessions to our already vibrant programme including *Little Creatives* for babies and their carers, *Young Tech Team* for young people to explore an interest in technical theatre and a brand new *Scottish Dance Theatre Community Company*.

Currently, we have 19 groups that meet in the building each week with the youngest participant being seven weeks old, and the oldest 92 years old!



# **Wings Around Dundee** (Live on stage)

Dundee Rep Ensemble returned to the stage to re-open the Rep in a wildly imaginative and brilliantly funny new play by two-time Fringe First Award-winner **John McCann**, directed by **Finn den Hertog**. This fantastical voyage of discovery through Dundee's empty streets and hidden past was the perfect way to welcome our audiences back into the theatre.

### **Walking towards COP26**

Inspired by the Pilgrimage for COP26, organised by Art and Ecology, Scottish Dance Theatre embarked on a three-day walk from Dundee to Falkirk, engaging in a process of embodied research and reflection on the climate emergency and environmental sustainability. Musician **Jer Reid** and digital artist **Harry Clark** joined the walk and created a video response documenting the journey to raise awareness amongst communities and company followers.



### **Rosemary Lee: Gather Together Here**

Continuing the creative dialogue between Scottish Dance Theatre and the independent dance sector in Scotland, *Gather Together Here* was a paid professional development opportunity for 16 dance artists based in Scotland to attend a one or two-day workshop with acclaimed choreographer and film-maker **Rosemary Lee**. Hosted in partnership with Dance North Scotland and supported by Creative Scotland, these workshops were a rare opportunity for dance practitioners in Scotland not only to get to know Lee's practice but also to connect and exchange with each other.



### October 2021

### **Together with**

We began a new programme of work in which to develop ongoing relationships with organisations and groups in the community and co create a bespoke programme of activity with and for them over time. We have partnerships with the youth work team at Finmill Community Centre, Jericho House which is a residential facility for men recovering from addictions and HMP Perth.







# **Antigone, Interrupted Tour**

Scottish Dance Theatre's first live tour since March 2020 saw **Joan Clevillé's Antigone, Interrupted**touring to 10 venues across the length and breadth of the UK, from Cornwall to the Scottish islands of Mull and Skye, thanks to the support of the Rural Touring Dance Initiative, a UK-wide programme bringing contemporary dance to rural communities. The work was also part of the programme at Dance International Glasgow, with a sold-out performance with BSL integration by **Yvonne Strain**.

# **Every Map Has A Scale (Chapter 2) / Sinder Screening**

While Dundee Rep was closed during the Covid-19 pandemic, both the Rep and Scottish Dance Theatre resident ensembles of actors and dancers collaborated with members of the Dundee community and created two new filmed pieces by Associate Directors **Jess Thorpe and Tashi Gore**: *Sinder* and *Every Map has a Scale (Chapter 2)*. This exciting new double bill from Dundee Rep and Scottish Dance Theatre saw the Rep's auditorium turning into a cinema for the first time ever for a series of special screenings after which the double bill was available to view on demand on REP STUDIOS.



### The Enemy

National Theatre of Scotland brought a radical re-imagining of the classic Henrik Ibsen play An Enemy of the People to the Rep. This uniquely Scottish take on Henrik Ibsen's work delighted over 1,000 audience members during its 5-day run.



# **TuTuMucky / Amethyst** (Live on stage)

Audiences at Dundee Rep were finally reunited with Scottish Dance Theatre in a dynamic triple bill programme featuring 合[Hé], the re-staging of *TuTuMucky* by **Botis Seva** and the world premiere of *Amethyst* by Glasgow-based choreographer **Mele Broomes**. The piece is an all-enveloping performance of visual and vocal vibrations inspired by the texture and guiding properties of the amethyst stone, with an original score by music producer **Plantainchipps** and lavish costume design by Scottish designer **Zephyr Liddell**.



**TLAT at Tokyo Arts Festival** 

Scottish Dance Theatre continued to prototype more environmentally sustainable ways of presenting work internationally, with the streaming of *The Life and Times* as part of the digital programme of **Tokyo Festival**. The festival, one of the most prestigious in Japan, brought together physically and virtually companies from all over the world. Artistic Director **Joan Clevillé** and company members also took part in the festival's *Dialogue Plus*programme, aimed at supporting emerging local performance makers.

### **#LoveDanceScotland Commissions**

The two #LoveDanceScotland commissions, **Shotput**'s *Totentanz* and **FRANK.K**'s *Living in the Space Between*, were finally premiered as part of Dance International Glasgow after a period of support and development offered by Dundee Rep and Scottish Dance Theatre in partnership with Dance Base Scotland and Tramway. This innovative programme saw these Scotland-based dance artists awarded a total of £70,000 as well as a substantial in-kind support package from the venue partners, drawing from their expertise as producers and presenters of dance in Scotland.






### **November 2021**

# This Is A Love Story (REP STUDIOS Live Stream)

This unique event marked a significant moment in the creative development of *THIS IS A LOVE STORY*. Our REP STUDIOS live stream performance was scheduled during COP26 and celebrating Dundee Rep's new **Climate Beacon** status, was the first opportunity for audiences to experience the show in a concert setting – performed by two actors with a live on-stage band and continuous creative captioning. The presentation of the work continues Dundee Rep's commitment to developing and platforming the most exciting and innovative new musical theatre writing. Over 200 people joined us in the auditorium, with a further 102 households from the UK, Cyprus, and France joining us via REP STUDIOS streaming the performance live and on-demand.





### **PECHAKUCHA**

We were delighted to have *PECHAKUCHA NIGHT DUNDEE* back on 4 November. This live event was streamed from the main stage of Dundee Rep Theatre into the comfort of our audience's homes and welcomed a packed audience, hosted by **Creative Dundee**.



## TuTuMucky / Amethyst

(Tour, The Place)

November saw the long-awaited return of Scottish Dance Theatre to London's iconic dance theatre, The Place. The autumn triple bill of *Amethyst*, 合[*Hé*] and *TuTuMucky* was received with full houses and standing ovations.

In the meantime, Associate Artist **Solène Weinachter** was in residence at the Rep's dance studio working as an independent choreographer on the creation of a new solo work, *After All*.



### December 2021



### A Christmas Carol (Live on stage)

We were delighted to open a slightly more stripped-back musical version of *A Christmas Carol*. As 2021 drew to a close, we took a moment to look back over these last 12 months and felt so proud. It's been lovely welcoming our audiences back to the Rep with our Autumn season after 18 months of being closed and we loved seeing our building buzzing again at Christmas. We are incredibly proud that we safely welcomed 9,000 people into the theatre during our run of *A Christmas Carol*.

# A Christmas Carol (REP STUDIOS)

On 12 December, we streamed *A Christmas Carol* live from the Rep to those who couldn't make it along in person bringing a little festive joy into their homes. Little did we know that Government Restrictions changed from Boxing Day, meaning that all live performances ceased until the end of the run on 31 December. Determined not to let our audiences miss out, we made our digital stream available from Christmas Eve to 2 January, on our digital platform, REP STUDIOS. During our run, we engaged with **266 households** across the world from Midlothian to Malta to Washington to California and Perthshire to Texas.


### **BC Scotland-Europe project**

Thanks to the support of **British Council Scotland**, Scottish Dance Theatre has been able to lead on an international project bringing together some of the most prominent repertory dance companies in Northern Europe: Skånes Dansteater (Sweden), Carte Blanche (Norway), tanzmainz (Germany) and Norrdans (Sweden). The Artistic Directors and Rehearsal Directors of the companies have been able to meet over six months to exchange best practice remotely and invite groundbreaking speakers to discuss topics such as environmental sustainability, equality, diversity, and inclusion and leadership and curatorial practices.

# **#LoveDanceScotland Recovery Bursaries**

Building on the success of its first iteration, the #LoveDanceScotland partners came together one more time to support independent dance artists based in Scotland with a programme

of Recovery Bursaries, providing the time, money and space for them to re-engage with their creative practice after the first stages of the pandemic. The fund of £70,000 supported 12 artists to devise and deliver a project of recovery and give audiences an insight into their practice.





# #RepSpring22

# SPRING 22 SEASON ANNOUNCED

We finally announced our Spring Season at the end of January and we couldn't have been more excited to have shows back in the building and on the Rep stage.





### **Green Achievement**

We received a funding grant of £16,940 from Theatres Trust to allow us to upgrade stage working lights, studio 3 and the outside front of house lighting. We will reduce our KWH output by 231,122.882, saving 5.729 tonnes  $CO_2$  and £2,773.49 per year.

### February 2022

### Shanghai children workshops

Working in collaboration with **Shanghai International Dance Center Theater**, Scottish Dance Theatre delivered a series of remote workshops with children 7–12 years old in Shanghai, leading to an informal sharing on the theatre's stage. Utilising the possibilities of digital technology, the workshops were an opportunity to successfully pilot new forms of international engagement and partnerships.



# India remote workshops and Attakkalari Dance Biennial

Scottish Dance Theatre delivered two remote residencies for 34 dance and theatre artists in India in partnership with **British Council**, with a particular focus on emerging female voices. Exploring the possibilities of dance in the digital field, the full company was involved in the delivery of the residencies, sharing dance and creative skills and leading to two online and in-person sharings in collaboration with **Attakkalari Centre for Movement Arts (Bengaluru)** and **Kolkata Centre for Creativity**. *The Life and Times* was also screened as part of the **Attakkalari India Biennial 2021**, reconnecting the company with its audiences in India.





# The Life and Times at Dundee Rep

The Life and Times returned to the stage of Dundee Rep on February 22. Continuing with the company's strand of digital work, the piece was streamed live via **Rep Studios** and through other partner venues. Live audiences were also able to experience the work as a hybrid performance from the Dundee Rep auditorium, bringing together the digital and physical modes of presentation in a single work.

### **OPTIMISM** (Live on stage)

Associate Directors Jess Thorpe and Tashi Gore presented their first live performance on the Dundee Rep Stage. OPTIMISM was devised and performed by the Rep Young Company and based on the Company members' personal experiences. Capturing the zeitgeist of the times and exploring themes such as the global pandemic, Brexit, social media, financial crisis - and their impact on young people's mental health - the show gave a platform to a different perspective on our collective future to the one dominating media, one that is full of hope, despite the odds.

**OPTIMISM** sold out on opening night and went to be selected to open the National Festival of Youth Theatre held at the Ayr Gaiety in July 2022.

### **Connecting with independent dance artists**

Despite the challenges brought by the pandemic, Scottish Dance Theatre continued to strengthen its connections to the independent dance ecology in Scotland through the year. This exchange with established and emerging dance artists took place in many different ways: contributing to talks and panels (RTDI Rural Mechanics course, YDance talk for emerging artists, The Work Room's Return to the studio, Abertay University...), artistic mentoring (23 hours of mentoring of 10 artists by AD **Joan Clevillé**), free studio residencies (3.5 weeks for 3 artists), workshop and open classes (16 instances), or the peer exchange programme *In Pairs*, which brought together eleven members of The Work Room with Scottish Dance Theatre's dancers.

# **Vanishing Point's Metamorphosis** (Live on stage)

Vanishing Point returned to the Rep with **Franz Kafka**'s hugely influential, tragicomic, iconic novella brought vividly to life in this international co-production.



### **PAST-inuous – Farah Saleh**

Bringing together virtually 11 dancers from the Palestinian diaspora, **Farah Saleh's** *PAST-inuous* was presented at Dundee Rep as an interactive live performance installation reflecting on the future of the Palestinian refugee cause and its connection to the global refugee condition.



### **Green Achievement**

At the end of 2021/2022 we ended the year on a saving of 90 tonnes CO<sub>2</sub>, our footprint down to 190 tonnes.

### **Craig Hill** Sat April 9

April started with a bang as we welcomed back Scotland's favourite "kilty" treasure, *Craig Hill – Pumped!* Craig is renowned world-wide for his cheeky, irreverent and uproarious live comedy and his tours are firmly established as one of the best nights out around.

### **UK National Dance Awards**

Scottish Dance Theatre were delighted to be nominated for the second consecutive year as **Best Mid-Scale Company** at the **UK National Dance Awards**.

### **Ray World Premiere**

April saw Scottish Dance Theatre's world premiere of *Ray* by internationally acclaimed choreographer *Meytal Blanaru*. Exploring the subjects of empathy and connection, Meytal and the team brought audiences and communities right into the heart of the creative process, hosting studio sharings every week of the creation, including members of the Ukrainian refugee community and our own Engage classes. After the premiere at Dundee Rep, *Ray* was invited to the iconic Traverse theatre, marking an emotive return of the company to Edinburgh since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic. We offered three micro-commissions to the following artists to develop an artistic response to a local climate issue; Kristina Aburrow, Alex Turner, and Tommy Small.

# **Green Achievement**

In the first 2 months of the new financial year, April and May, we managed to save 36,230Kwh compared to 2019. Over this period our energy costs increased by 60%. This energy saving is helping to keep costs as low as possible AND has already saved 7.42 tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub>.



# Antigone, Interrupted: International and Scotland tour

After two fantastic nights at the HEREANDNOW Festival in Mannheim, Germany, Scottish Dance Theatre travelled the length and breadth of Scotland, bringing *Antigone, Interrupted* to theatres, festivals and highschools in St Andrews, Islay, Inverness, Banchory and Glasgow. The tour culminated in a sold-out run back home at Dundee Rep, and included performances with BSL Integration for D/deaf audiences.



### The Bookies Tue 3 – Sat 21 May

May welcomed the World Premiere production of black comedy, *The Bookies*. Written by **Michael Burnett** and **Joseph McCann**, we also welcomed back Director Sally Reid for this witty and riotous production, enjoyed by over 2,300 people across its run.

### **REP Stripped** Wed 1 – Sat 4 June

Following its success in 2019, our festival of new work – *REP STRIPPED* was back! From live readings and gig theatre to promenade performances and scratch nights, Dundee Rep was transformed to present work both on our stage and behind the scenes in different and unusual spaces throughout the theatre. Featuring a diverse range of exciting, cutting-edge work from some of the country's most innovative creative voices, *REP STRIPPED* gave audiences a first peek and unique opportunity to see new ideas and experimental work in the early stages of development. One of its successes was *No Love Songs* that later became one of our most popular and successful shows when it returned to Dundee and premiered at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe in 2023.

# DYMT: KIPPS Mon 6 – Sat 11 June

Dundee Youth Music Theatre returned to Dundee Rep Theatre with the energy-packed musical *KIPPS - THE NEW HALF A SIXPENCE MUSICAL.* With an outstanding cast, an incredible live band and dazzling choreography, this dynamic youth company brought to life a toetapping musical on stage.





# **Thunderstruck** Fri 17 – Sat 18 June

Audiences were captivated as award-winning production *Thunderstruck* took to the Dundee Rep stage with the legacy and mythology of a Pitlochry bin man, who flew beyond the summit of his art and changed Scottish music forever by defying established tradition and pushing to the absolute edge of what was possible.





### **Threaded Fine**

Rosemary Lee's *Threaded Fine* brought together Scottish Dance Theatre with a cast of 18 other Scotland-based dancers aged 7 to 70+ in two epic 5 hour performances in Findhorn and Dundee's Magdalen Green reaching hundreds of people and passers-by. The project was made possible thanks to close collaboration with Dance North and London-based producers Artsadmin.

### In Pairs peer support programme

In June, we hosted the final meeting of *In Pairs*, a peer support programme bringing together Scottish Dance Theatre dancers with nine independent dance artists and members of The Work Room. The programme supported the dancers on a nine month process of self-directed reflection and exchange, fostering a more dynamic and porous relationship between the company and the independent dance sector in Scotland.



### **Boost Festival** Wed 22 June – Sat 26 June

After two years of waiting, we finally welcomed our weekly classes groups back on to the stage. *BOOST Festival* included 19 performances and workshops from over 200 performers aged between 7 weeks and 92 years old. Each group was given the same starting point of a clock and was tasked with making an original piece of theatre or dance inspired by their own interpretation of it.



### **Green Achievement**

On June 2nd, we received fantastic news that we had made the finals of the prestigious Vibes awards 2022. On Monday 13th we started the refurbishment of the front-of-house public toilets. A momentous day for Dundee Rep!

### **Autumn 2022 Season Launch**

On June 30th we launched our Autumn season announcing an exciting collection of new shows coming to the Dundee Rep stage. This launch produced over £6,000 worth of sales within the first 12 hours of going on sale.



### **July 2022**

### **Together with HMP Perth**

We worked with 12 men in HMP Perth to devise a performance around the idea of the music that has been meaningful to them in their lives. The group practised positive skills in communication, collaboration and story-telling and the final work was shared with the wider community across the prison.



### **OPTIMISM at NFYT/Tayside Climate Beacon**

The Rep Young company were delighted to open the National Festival of Youth Theatre at the Ayr Gaiety Theatre with their piece *OPTIMISM*. A cast of 16 went along to the festival and camped for the weekend in Ayr. They watched a programme of shows created by young people from across Scotland, took part in workshops and made new friends. Some of the cast went on to perform an extract at the Tayside Climate Beacon event at DCA and were part of a panel discussing how young people feel about climate change.

# **Choreographers in residence**in the Scottish Dance Theatre studio

Scottish Dance Theatre works in its own dedicated studio at Dundee Rep, with the company in residence for most weeks of the year. However, as part of Scottish Dance Theatre's commitment to artistic development, it offers the space free of charge to other dance artists to develop their work. In summer '23, we welcomed emerging choreographer **Robert Bennett** in partnership with **Birds of Paradise Theatre Company**, Scotland's premier disability-led theatre company. Dundee-based independent choreographers **Niamh O'Loughlin** and **Solène Weinachter** have also been in residence at different points during the year.

During the toilet refurbishment, we donated all the old fittings to Scrap Antics and all skip loads were recycled. Nothing went to landfill – only 94 kg of CO<sub>2</sub> was produced (including travel.)

# Antigone, Interrupted sell-out run at the Edinburgh Fringe

Joan Clevillé's *Antigone, Interrupted* was presented at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe as part of the **Made in Scotland Showcase**. The 10-day sold out run was received with rave reviews, standing ovations, and invitations from international programmers in Argentina, Brazil and India.

### **Toilets Upgrade**

A long-awaited and much-needed upgrade on the building's public toilets was completed over the summer with a ribbon-cutting ceremony on 12 August. Upstairs, a new fully accessible toilet and changing place was installed alongside seven new self-contained unisex stalls. Downstairs both sets of toilets were refreshed and the capacity of the ladies toilets was increased to three. This substantial project was funded through the generosity of Backstage Trust, The Foyle Foundation, Northwood Charitable Trust, and The William Syson Foundation.

### **Together with the Bella Centre**

In September, the Engage team started a new **Together With** residency in the Bella Centre, the new community justice unit opened in the Hilltown in Dundee. The women have been working with **Amanda Lowson** on theatre, new writing and building community through the Arts.

# Scottish Dance Theatre Participation Strand


Since its humble beginnings in 1986, community engagement and socially engaged practice have been embedded in Scottish Dance Theatre's identity. In addition to all the work led by the Engage team, the company delivered 45 engagement sessions in this financial year for more than 1,200 participants in Dundee and on the road. These included community and vocational schools' workshops and creative sessions, open rehearsals, sharings and talks.



### October 2022

### **Scottish Dance Theatre Young Company perform at Dance Live**

The Scottish Dance Theatre Young Company took their performance of **Twenty past eight on a Sunday** to Dance Live in Aberdeen. Created by Scottish choreographer **Taylor Han** the piece was originally presented at BOOST Festival '22 and then went on to be included in this national dance platform.



### **Scotland and UK Tour of Ray**

Meytal Blanaru's *Ray* toured to venues across the UK, including Déda (Derby) and The Place in London, one of the country's epicentres of contemporary dance, before returning to Scotland to visit the rural community of Ardrishaig in Mid-Argyll, Dundee University (as part of the university's Festival of the Future) and the newly-refurbished Aberdeen Art Gallery as part of the Dance Live festival.

# Double Bill programme at Dundee Rep

November saw the return of two of the most visually striking works in the repertoire of Scottish Dance Theatre: *RITUALIA* by Scottish choreographer **Colette Sadler** and *The Circle* by internationally acclaimed choreographer **Emanuel Gat**. The works were received enthusiastically by audiences at Dundee Rep and were accompanied by a series of public events, including a live sketching session for local artists and an open rehearsal led by Artistic Director **Joan Clevillé**, giving an insight to audiences and participants into the sources of inspiration and choreographic languages of the works.





### Cinderella

Sat 26 Nov - Sat 31 Dec

Written and composed by Lynda Radley and Michael John McCarthy, our elemental retelling of classic *Cinderella* was a new musical adaptation of one of the most magical stories ever told. Alongside our 49 performances across the run, we had a very special one-night only live streamed performance, taking the show into nearly 100 homes.

### **December 2022**

As a centre for artistic excellence, Scottish Dance Theatre is committed to contributing to the development of the new generation of dance artists and to cultivating a porous and dynamic relationship with the rest of the dance ecology in Scotland and the UK. As well as hosting two nine-month placements through the **Professional Placement Scheme of Northern School of Contemporary Dance**, the company reached **more than 350 artists through 132 artist development sessions** in this financial year. The sessions included professional classes and placements, as well as one-to-one mentoring from Artistic Director **Joan Clevillé** and other company members.

### **January 2023**

### New Dance Artist

Dance Artist John Ross joined the Engage Team at the start of 2023. Originally from Dundee, John is an experienced dancer, facilitator and choreographer and recently moved back up to Scotland after being based in London and working internationally.

# **World premiere of Moving Cloud** at the Celtic Connections Festival

Working in collaboration with the renowned Celtic Connections festival, Scottish Dance Theatre premiered *Moving Cloud*, a new work by choreographer Sofia Nappi and a live band of 14 folk musicians as part of the festival's 30th anniversary edition. The work was previewed in front of 2,400 people at the festival's opening gala at Glasgow's Royal Concert Hall and then enjoyed by nearly a thousand more in two sold out performances at Tramway.


### **Dundee Rep: Architecture in Context**

In 2022 Dundee Rep celebrated its 40th year in Tay Square and was granted A-listed status by Historic Environment Scotland for the building's special architectural significance, exceptional design quality, as well as its contribution to civic life, society and culture in Scotland in the late 20th century. In celebration of this occasion we presented **Dundee Rep: Architecture in Context**, a presentation by two outstanding speakers on 2 February.

**Richard Russell OBE**, of Nicoll Russell Studios, was one of two lead architects who designed and built Dundee Rep. Ric shared the story of the conception and design of this purpose-built structure within the city of Dundee in 1982. **Dr Alistair Fair, FRHistS**, is a Reader in Architectural History at the University of Edinburgh. Upon his recommendation to Historic Environment Scotland, Dundee Rep was placed under consideration and evaluation for A-listed status.

### **Scottish Dance Theatre in Buenos Aires**

Artistic Director **Joan Clevillé** and Associate Artist and performer **Solène Weinachter** crossed the Atlantic to present the first ever performance of a Scottish Dance Theatre work in Argentina. **Antigone, Interrupted** opened the Festival Internacional de Buenos Aires, one of the most prestigious theatre and dance festivals in Latin America. In addition to three free, sold-out performances, the team delivered a series of professional development and participation sessions, maximising the impact of the company's visit for local civic and artistic communities.



# Choreographer Placement with Bridie Gane

Working in partnership with **Dance Base**, **Scotland's National Centre for Dance**, Scottish Dance Theatre welcomed Edinburgh-based choreographer **Bridie Gane** on a week's placement with the company. The placement provided her with the opportunity to gain experience of working within a repertory company context, and to research and develop ideas the studio with multiple dancers in a safe, supportive and inclusive environment.

# Scottish Dance Theatre and the Edinburgh Futures Institute

Artistic Director **Joan Clevillé** hosted a multidisciplinary event at the Traverse theatre with author and researcher **Dr Marisa de Andrade**, Senior Lecturer in Health Science & Society at University of Edinburgh. Featuring excerpts from the company's repertoire, the event explored the notion of embodied research in the arts, academia and science, and was part of a series of events curated by the **Edinburgh Futures Institute** to spark innovative thinking and collaboration across fields and disciplines.



### **Teaching Artist CPD**

The wider Engage team started a programme of CPD sessions designed to nurture and support our community of Artists engaged in social practice. Associate Directors **Jess Thorpe** and **Tashi Gore** ran the first session around devising based on their book 'A beginners guide to Devising Theatre'. Future sessions include **John Ross** on 'Ideas for creating choreography', **Amanda Lowson** on 'Creativity and Inclusion' and Tashi on 'the Critical Response Process'. The team really valued sharing ideas in this way and developing our work together.



### **Smile**

Sat 18 Feb - Sat 11 Mar

After sell-out live performances and an international digital tour in 2020/21, audience favourite *Smile* was back once again. *Smile* was also available as a VR performance, available through pay-per-view on Neon8's Box Office VR site.



### Pain & I Sat 4 – Sun 19 Mar





# **The Third Sister** Fri 24 Mar

*The Third Sister* tells the dark, mysterious yet funny tale of three teenage sisters who secretly formed a punk band. This show was performed in English and British Sign Language, and was free to attend, making the show accessible to a range of new and familiar audiences.
