The beating heart of Cornwall for over 170 years, we call Truro's old City Hall our home. Built back in 1847, the building is Grade II* listed and full of secrets waiting to be shared. 
Across our programme over the last 20 years we've continued in that founding tradition of variety and quality, proud of the audience we've grown and the shows we've

Helped 100,000 young people discover the self belief and confidence they need to flourish.

Fed £16 million a year into Cornwall's creative economy.

Welcomed 2 million people to 3,700 performances.

Given more than 10,000 visitors the chance to experience theatre for the first time.

Created a high quality, varied programme for one of the most socio-economically diverse audiences in the country.

But we want to do so much more. In June 2018 we closed the doors of our building but opened a new door in our story. We're undertaking a radical transformation to create a space that matches our ambition.

Our current transformation will reawaken the beauty and history of City Hall, opening Hall for Cornwall up to the people, ideas and potential that make this corner of Britain so exciting.

Looking ahead & reaching further With our new home as our heart and our feet firmly rooted in Cornwall's rich heritage, we'll beat louder and reach further than ever before.

We want to welcome over 300,000 people a year through our doors and give 50,000 young people the chance to shine on stage and off over the next five years. We want to bring ideas to Cornwall and take Cornish ideas out to the world. And we want to build a venue that warmly welcomes people, meeting them as they are and giving them a memorable experience every time they come here.
