




A GUIDE TO FOOD, DRINK, ATTRACTIONS & ACTIVITIES IN & AROUND ST JUST

As part of your **St Just Ordinalia theatre experience**, we are delighted to be able to share with you a mini-guide to places to get **food and drink** in the local **St Just area** as well as some suggestions for other things to do whilst you are here which includes **lovely walks, useful apps, places to visit**. We obviously highly recommend that you try to see the original play scripts which are on temporary loan from The Bodleian Libraries to Kresen Kernow (Cornwall's archive centre in Redruth) as part of their **Out of the Ordinary exhibition**. Café Dog and Rabbit

Zenor, St Ives TR26 3BY
Dating back to 1271, the Tinner's has been the heart of village life in Zenor for over 700 years. Originally built to house the masons who built St Senara's Church (featuring the infamous mermaid of Zenor carving), the Tinnars offers a trip back in time with a cosy log fire, legendary folk music sessions and home cooked food sourced from local farms and fishing ports. The Tinner's is family and dog friendly and features both indoor and outdoor seating in their large, sunny garden. Currently the Tinner's are not taking bookings.

Free entry available for Tate members all year round. Wheelchair access by prior appointment only.

Kresen Kernow
Little Vauxhall, Redruth TR15 1AS
Mes a'n Kemmyn/Out of the Ordinary exhibition 22 June – 25 Sept
Kresen Kernow ('Cornwall Centre') is home to the world's largest collection of documents, books, maps and photographs related to Cornwall's history.
This summer, their new temporary exhibition, Mes a'n Kemmyn/Out of the Ordinary, unites The Cornish Ordinalia and The Creation of the World (on loan from the Bodleian Libraries at the University of Oxford) with The Life of St Meriadoc and The Life of St Kea (on loan from the National Library of Wales in Aberystwyth) under one roof for the first time in history – that's hundreds of years.
Inspired by the exhibition, Kresen Kernow is hosting a summer of celebratory events and activities, including: online talks, a symposium, school projects, learning workshops, performances and summer holiday family learning events through partnerships with Hall for Cornwall and Shallah Dance Theatre.

Geevor Tin Mine
Pendeen TR19 7EW
Geevor Tin Mine is the key centre within the Cornish Mining World Heritage Site and tells the story of Cornish tin and copper mining through immersive and interactive museum exhibits and even a guided tour through a disused mine shaft.

St Michael's Mount & The St Aubyn Estates
St Michael's Mount is a historic castle and island community off the coast of Marazion managed in partnership by the National Trust and the St Aubyn family. At low tide, the island is visitable by foot via the causeway, and at high tide, boats run to and from the island.

Glasney College
Glasney College was a large church and college built in 1265. It was the centre of Cornish culture and language and was where the original Ordinalia plays were written and performed. The dissolution of the monasteries led to the destruction of Glasney College in 1548 but there is a remnant of old wall and an arch. You can visit the park in Penryn to see the old site.

WALKING/ PLACES OF INTEREST



Porth Nanven (Cot Valley)
Porth Nanven, also known as 'Dinosaur Egg Beach' due to its round, egg-like boulders, is situated about half a mile from St Just. A walk through the beautiful Cot Valley will get you there in 30 minutes however there is also a small car park next to the beach. Porth Nanven is a great place for cliff top walks and scenic photography and, at low tide, is a perfect place for a dip in the sea.
Note: there is no wheelchair access onto the beach however the views can still be enjoyed from the cliff top. There is also no lifeguard service at this beach.

Cape Cornwall and Priest's Cove.
Cape Cornwall is an iconic, National Trust-owned headland sat above rugged Priest's Cove. Cape Cornwall is a half hour walk from St Just or accessible by car in five minutes. It includes facilities such as toilets. Dogs are not permitted in the cove from Easter Sun until September 30th.
Open 10am – 4pm
Car park and the Little Wonder Café (Weds – Sun 10am – 4pm)

Botallack
Botallack, one of the filming locations for Poldark, provides a snapshot into the Cornish Mining World Heritage Site with rugged granite cliffs littered with disused mine workings and engine houses. It is located along the North Coast between St Just and Pendeen and has a small pay and display National Trust car park.

Lands End
Sennen TR19 7AA
Lands End is a legendary Cornish landmark named by the Ancient Greeks as Belerion or 'place of the sun'. It is now famous for its beautiful scenery, cliff top walks, and pay-as-you-go family attractions.

Compostela de Santiago pilgrimage (St. Michael's Way)
St Michael's Way is a micro coast-to-coast pilgrimage in West Cornwall. The route was created after the discovery of ancient shipping rosters proving that pilgrims historically came to Lelant by sea on their way to Santiago de Compostela, and travelled over land to Marazion to avoid the waters of Lands End. St Michael's Way is the only pilgrimage route in Britain that is officially part of a European Cultural Route.

Mousehole
Mousehole is a tiny fishing village in west Cornwall, named after its infamously small harbour entrance, the 'mouse hole' and home to the Cornish legend of the Mousehole Cat. In 1595 the entire village was burnt to the ground by the Spanish Armada except for one house which still stands today.

Paul
The Parish of Paul is an ancient village located west of Penzance. The churchyard dedicates a memorial to Dolly Pentreath, reputedly the last native speaker of the Cornish language. The church also houses a monument which is said to be the last surviving inscription of the Cornish language. The atmospheric King's Arms pub is the centre of the community in Paul and was said to have been housing for the builders who constructed the church tower in the 15th Century.

iwalk Cornwall
iwalk is an app devised for GPS-guided walks. It features over 260 walks ranging from 2 to 10 miles, most of which are circular. The app is compatible for both Apple and Android phones and includes in-purchases.
