- Video Resource Bank covering a wide range of subjects and phases, full lessons and mentoring and coaching sessions for use in training and development programmes with trainees, ECTs, mentors and teacher educators.
- Teacher Educator Programmes, Member Workshops and our extremely popular Expresso Shot Networking Events.

I am delighted with the feedback we have received on these, and other services we offer, but would particularly highlight the impact that our *ITT Criteria Compliance Audit, Curriculum Design*

and Assessment Toolkit and NASBTT Networks Live have had on our members. I would like to thank the whole NASBTT team for their incredible hard work and diligence in making these products and services available for our 250 members, who represent more than 12,000 individual trainees.
