Schools White Paper: *Every child achieving and thriving* – statement from NASBTT

NASBTT has published its initial response to [Every child achieving and thriving](#), and the government's reforms to the schools and SEND systems in England.

Following on from the release of [A first look at the Schools White Paper](#), NASBTT CEO Emma Hollis commented:

“The White Paper sets out a long-term vision for the education system in England, rather than an immediate set of requirements for ITT providers. While many of the proposals will take time to develop and some will evolve through further policy announcements, there are some early signals about the direction of travel and this provides valuable insight. For providers, the most immediate task is not wholesale programme redesign but careful reflection on how emerging policy priorities may influence training programmes, partnerships and future workforce expectations. By beginning to reflect on the questions presented in our member briefing, providers can ensure their programmes remain forward-looking, responsive and aligned with the evolving needs of schools, teachers and pupils alike.”
