The Teaching Excellence Framework ("TEF") was launched by the government in 2015. Its aim is to monitor and assess the quality of teaching and learning in English higher education institutions, including those (like Nelson College London) in the privately-funded sector, in order to ensure that all students receive an excellent teaching experience.

It will use a set of metrics to measure the quality of teaching and learning at each institution, and will make the results publicly available.

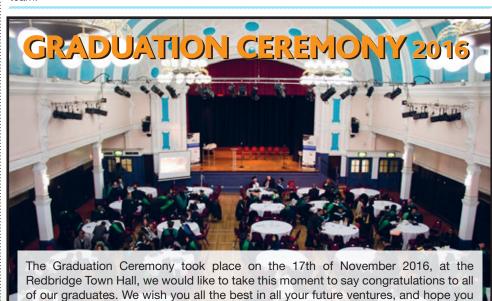

## **Student Reviewers**

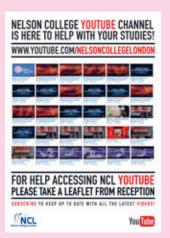

### **National Student Survey**

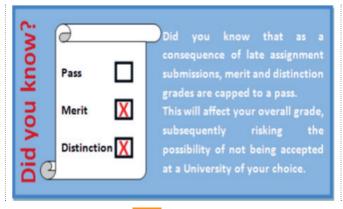
• Gants Hill reception
