This 96-hour work placement is designed to augment your theoretical, in-class knowledge with real world application. 



### DIGITAL LITERACY IN HIGHER EDLICATION:

# A LIBRARIAN'S PERSPECTIVE

### Introduction

In an era where information is abundant and accessible within seconds, digital literacy has become a cornerstone of academic success. For students in higher education, navigating the digital landscape is more than just using technology—it involves critical thinking, evaluating information sources, and responsible digital citizenship. As a librarian, I witness firsthand the challenges and opportunities digital tools present to our students and academic staff.

### What is Digital Literacy?

Digital literacy is finding, evaluating, creating, and communicating information using digital technologies. It's not only about technical proficiency, but also includes:

- **Information Literacy** In our digital world, there is a flood of information from various sources. Information Literacy includes knowing what you need to know and understanding the scope and depth of the information. It involves finding information efficiently - knowing where to search and using keywords, the right search engines and research tools. Judging sources' reliability, credibility and relevance is also a core component. Students can evaluate information critically by distinguishing between fact, opinion and misinformation.
- Media Literacy Students should understand how to access, analyse, evaluate and create information using all forms of media. Media Literacy is important as it promotes critical thinking about the media we consume daily, protects against misinformation, and encourages responsible use of social media and other digital platforms.
- Cybersecurity Awareness is the understanding and knowledge of how to protect yourself, your data, and your devices from digital threats such as hacking, phishing, malware, identity theft, and other online risks. It is about being alert to potential cyber dangers and knowing how to respond to them safely and responsibly.

# Library Learnin

Digital Etiquette is a set of rules and guidelines for appropriate, respectful, and responsible behaviour when using digital devices and online platforms. It helps ensure positive communication and interaction in digital environments.

### The Librarian's Role in Fostering Digital Literacy

Academic librarians are uniquely positioned at the intersection of technology, pedagogy, and information access. What could support look like for students and staff?

- Workshops and Tutorials: Covering topics like source evaluation, citation tools, avoiding plagiarism, and using academic databases.
- One-to-One Support: Helping students discern between credible and biased sources.
- **Integration with Curriculum:** Partnering with academic staff to embed digital literacy into assignments and course objectives.

### **Common Digital Literacy Challenges for Students**

1. Information Overload

Students often struggle to filter reliable information from the noise of the internet.

2. Misinformation and Bias

Recognising bias and fake news is increasingly difficult in algorithm-driven platforms.


3. Lack of Training

Many students enter higher education with basic IT skills but lack advanced research capabilities.

4. Digital Distractions

Managing focus in a hyper-connected world is another overlooked literacy skill.




