
Welsh Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE) Study

- Over 2,000 adults aged 18-69 years participated in the ACE Study for Wales:
- Did you live with anyone who was a problem drinker or alcoholic?
- 14% been exposed to alcohol abuse in the household
- For every 100 adults in Wales 47 have suffered at least one ACE during their childhood and 14 have suffered 4 or more.
- Compared with people with no ACEs, those with 4+ ACEs are:
- 4 times more likely to be a high-risk drinker







Key Messages

ACEs aren't another intervention. It's about working differently.


- Learning from each other, sharing experiences about what works and understanding why
- Making the most of what is already out there, with everyone speaking the same language
- Striving for the same goal
- This isn't about signposting, it's about all of us taking responsibility and focusing on people, not process.





ACE – Informed Approach

- An ACE-Informed approach incorporates:
- Realizing the prevalence of trauma
- Recognizing how it affects all individuals involved with the program, organization or system, including its own workforce
- Resisting re-traumatization
- Responding by putting this knowledge into practice



ACE/Trauma Informed (Enabling) Environment Or Psychologically Informed Environment

- Places where positive relationships promote well-being for all participants
- Places where people experience a sense of belonging
- Places where all people involved contribute to the growth and well-being of others
- Places where people can learn new ways of relating
- Places that recognise and respect the contributions of all parties in helping relationships




Key Messages

Everybody and every organisation in Wales has a part to play.

- There is a role for all of us, challenging ourselves to think 'What can I do differently?', and recognising what we're already doing.
- Little steps make big changes, we can change the narrative.
- Creating an ACE informed Wales will bring benefits for everyone.
