### 8. Troubleshooting

Resetting the touchscreen

- · Key card or app not working
- Charge port stuck
- Common alerts and what they mean

### 9. Warranty & Support

- Basic vehicle warranty (4 years/50,000 miles)
- Battery & Drive Unit warranty (8 years/100k–150k miles depending on model)
- How to schedule service via Tesla app

### 10. Emergency Information

- Roadside assistance
- Jump-starting 12V system
- Fire safety (do not use water on battery fire)
- First responder information
