June 17th – 19th saw over 300 OB-PS Supporters and Guests come together for the first ever OB-PS online virtual event, Together We Rise.

The event gave supporters the chance to connect during a time when for many of us travel was not possible. Barbara Putney, USA, Global Award

Barbara is a lifetime member of GSUSA and has been an active girl and adult volunteer for over 40 years. As a girl, her favourite Girl Scout activity was camping, be it in a troop house or at a primitive site and this interest has continued to present day. With a degree in microbiology and trained as an electron microscopist, she has delighted in girls' activities with STEM as a Girl Scout Gold Award mentor. Joining OB-PS has opened up even more opportunities for her to experience the impact of our world-wide Movement on the development of girls and young women, and she is very grateful for the ability to support these efforts.



Zaha Rina Zahari, Malaysia, Princess Benedikte Award

A life time of guiding experience began when Zaha Rina joined brownies at the age of six in 1967 in Malaysia. When she went to college in the UK in 1979 she continued in the Girl Guide Movement and became a Brownie Leader at the St Chad's Church Brownie pack in Leeds from 1980 to 1984. Her mother Hendon, was Chief Commissioner of Girl Guides Malaysia for 13 years and gifted her with an OB-PS membership in 1992.

Zaha Rina first joined the OB-PS Board from 1993-1996 and in 1996 organised the OB-PS event in Malaysia. In 2008 she organised a trip for OB-PS Patron and Board to Sharjah, UAE. She has enjoyed over 50 years as a Girl Guide and believes in the positive impact that WAGGGS has had in her life and millions of other young women worldwide. Having a global career as a Financial Consultant and sitting on Multinational Boards , she was appointed a consultant to OB-PS Board in 2019, and is now a Princess Benedikte awardee and a major donor to Friends of Asia Pacific.

Connect with other Girl Guides and Girl Scouts from around the world to celebrate the Movement you love at this year's annual Global Campfire, where we will be Walking Together and Walking Far. Enjoy an online journey to all five World Centres and feel the diversity of our Movement. Menstrual Hygiene Day on May 28th saw a moment of celebration as Girl Guides and Girl Scouts from around the world used their creativity, voices, and actions to advocate for better menstrual hygiene for all women and girls. The Movement came together for a week of activities to celebrate Red Pride Week 2021. The Ghana Girl Guides Association (GGGA) launched their #DontTaxMyPeriod social media and letter writing campaign, appealing to the government to fulfil its promise of making sanitary pads tax-free for young women and girls in Ghana.

Phase 2 of **Free Being Me (FBM)** has officially come to an end. The programme has spanned over 125 countries and reached over 6.5 million young women and girls with life changing body confidence and self-esteem education, and advocacy. Recent evaluations showed that 9 out of 10 Leaders would recommend FBM to other Leaders and that 88% of girls and young women felt the programme improved their self-esteem! WAGGGS have now entered the third phase of their long-standing partnership with the Dove Self Esteem Project, and the hope is that over 50 different Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting Associations will take part allowing WAGGGS to support an additional 3.6 million young people. With the support of the British Film Institute, the 2020/2021 cohort of Body Confidence Advocates created some films about their personal advocacy projects which we are thrilled to be able to share with you today. Coordinator and Ambassadors updates: since the last newsletter in April, we have had two changes to OB-PS National Coordinators. The loss of Janet Hopkins, former OB-PS Staff Member: We were all saddened to learn of the unexpected death in early May of Janet Hopkins, former OB-PS Executive for WAGGGS. Janet joined WAGGGS in the 1990s, from a senior administrative role in another not-for-profit. She became Administration Director, managing the work around four World Conferences, the Constitutions Committee, and the central office at the World Bureau. Later she took on responsibility for OB-PS.

As a colleague, she was always supportive and fun to work with, and her smile lit up a room. After retiring from her full-time WAGGGS role, she continued to support OB-PS and its Board, working mostly from home. With her keen mind, eye for detail, sense of humour, and absolute commitment to girls and young women through OB-PS, she was a strong influence on the structure and ways of work of the Society for over a decade. She was made an OB-PS supporter in 2009 to crystallise that commitment. Married to Norman Owen for over 30 years, their 'retirement' in the village of Keevil, Wiltshire, opened up a wide range of different volunteer roles that supported and enhanced the life of the village and its residents. That village and WAGGGS recently paid tribute to a special person, friend, and colleague. She will be much missed.

OB-PS Board Member Spotlight, Chris Burton

- I have been involved with Girl Guides of Canada since I was six years old. I went through the entire girl program, receiving the Gold Cord upon completing Rangers. I have held many different positions with Girl Guides, continuing to be a Unit Leader until I became Chief Commissioner of Girl Guides of Canada.
- I joined OB-PS in 2015 and have been on the OB-PS Board of Directors for five years starting in Sangam, India. My twin daughters are also OB-PS Supporters. My mother never was involved with Girl Guides but wanted to support myself and my daughters in our Guiding journey, so when she passed away, money from her legacy paid for my daughter's memberships. We have been fortunate to have travelled to OB-PS functions together and shared the phenomenal experiences of meeting Girl Guides and Girl Scouts from other countries. My daughters are both heavily involved with Girl Guides as Unit Leaders and Commissioners at the Area and Provincial levels.
- As Chief Commissioner for Girl Guides of Canada and later as Canadian International Commissioner, I had the privilege to participate in several World and Western Hemisphere Conferences and started to understand the impact that WAGGGS has on girls and young women. At these conferences we were able to support other Member Organisations (MOs) by providing funds to pay their membership fees and by supporting a country in becoming a Full Members of WAGGGS. This ignited my passion of supporting other MOs in their journey.
- I think I truly started to understand the terrific impact that WAGGGS has on girls and young women and how important this work was for global communities when I heard Sister Lucy speak in India. I was overwhelmed by Sister Lucy's story and how her work has impacted so many lives. I also was inspired by the work of Green Tara in trying to improve the lives of girls and young women through education and apprenticeship skill training. These stories spoke to me and the need to provide financial support through OB-PS to continue the work that WAGGGS has started in so many countries.
- Being on the OB-PS Board provided me with the background information to really see the impact of OB-PS funding. The funds raised through OB-PS are unrestricted funds that can be used for projects when the need arises. I heard how WAGGGS was supporting Girl Guides in Malaysia protesting Child Brides and due to OB-PS funding could send a team to help drive this movement.
- I believe that WAGGGS has grown in many ways throughout this last pandemic year. We may have less members worldwide, less staff and less funding but as an organization, WAGGGS has made the necessary adjustments to step forward in become a leader in the global community. Much of this has happened due to the continued financial support of OB-PS members. Thank you!

OB-PS Board Member Spotlight, Lena Mitts



- Greetings from Helsinki, Finland. The story about me joining the Society resembles the story of so many of you. The decision is rarely made overnight but is the result of persuasion by active members of the Society.
- Many of you may know Doris Stockmann, one of the founding members of OB-PS and former chair of the WAGGGS World Board. She kept inviting me to Finnish OB-PS gatherings and asked me to join the planning team for the OB-PS annual event in Tampere, 2015. To ensure that I understood the concept of an annual event, I registered as a guest for the event in Hong Kong, 2014. That event marked the beginning of my OB-PS journey. I must admit that in Hongkong I concentrated more on socializing with new friends than on the actual substance of the event, and what fun I had.
- My OB-PS story continued with the election to the OB-PS board at the annual event in India, 2016. My daughter Ida Ringbom joined the Society at the event in Gilwell Park, 2017 and my husband Johan Ringbom in Tokyo, 2018. However, joining OB-PS is not only about persuasion, certainly not. It is not about payback either, as we do not owe anything to the Guiding and Scouting movement regardless of everything we have experienced. I joined OB-PS because I believe that WAGGGS is the guarantor of a uniform and international Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting Movement with Member Organisations honouring the same mission and vision upholding our inherent values. Although the guiding and scouting activities differ depending on local circumstances, the educational programme of WAGGGS' Member Organisations contributes to achieving the vision of a better and safer world for girls and young women.
- When Susan Campbell was elected President of OB-PS, the work and engagement of the Board rose to a new level. Thanks to Susan, the good mixture of personalities and skills on the Board, and the quick adaption to digital working methods, the Board has accomplished more during the last 18 months than during several previous years. As I am the head of a law firm in Helsinki and working very long days in my office, I am not able to devote as much time to board work as some of my fellow board members. However, everybody's contribution is important and I am convinced that the fundraising result of OB-PS will soon reflect the active input of many of the board members. And not to forget our staff – without Inga and Seren OB-PS would achieve very little. I admire their energy, devotion and patience.
- Although the main focus of OB-PS is and shall be fundraising, the social aspect and all new contacts is an enjoyable spin-off. I do hope that we will be able to arrange the event in Malaysia in 2022. See you there!

WAGGGS Staff Spotlight

Paul Bigmore, Head of Programmes

I took my first job at the World Bureau as the Fundraising Manager in 2008. A few weeks earlier I had never heard of WAGGGS and was considering another role at London Zoo. I had been a Cub and Scout in the UK, so had some limited personal experience. At the point of starting my new role, I had a baby daughter. I thought, I would be happy to work for an organisation that helps girls reach their full potential. That baby is about to turn 14 and her younger sister is a Guide where we live in south London.



In my early years at WAGGGS Janet Hopkins and Annelise Pouliquen, both sadly no longer with us, were the staff team for OB-PS. For a time, Joanne Joyce was the OB-PS staff lead and a young intern named Inga joined us in the Fundraising team – I think some of you may know her. OB-PS members were important volunteers within the wider fundraising work. I worked closely with Helen Laird, together we successfully fundraised for the World Conference in Edinburgh. Elaine Paterson, Vibeke Riemer and Helle Bechgaard were key members of our first WAGGGS Fund Development Committee.

In 2016, I changed roles from Deputy Director of Fund Development to a new role – Head of Global Programmes. A year later, I had the pleasure of speaking at an OB-PS gathering in Gilwell Park about our global programmes. It has been such an honour to see our global programmes grow and improve over the last five years. The WAGGGS I joined had only a handful of organisational partners funding our programme offer. Now we have a strong list of donors supporting programmes such as Free Being Me, Girl Powered Nutrition, Surf Smart, the YESS Girls Movement and our Stop the Violence campaign.

Our global programme offer has evolved over time. We have got better at understanding what Member Organisations need from WAGGGS and how to work as equal partners with them and our external donors. We've developed ways to co-create programmes with girls and volunteer leaders, along with the world's leading topic experts. Our monitoring and evaluation of programmes is stronger now and all our programmes follow a vigorous results-based management approach.

The last eighteen months have been tough for girls, for our Movement and for the global programmes team. So much of Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting has relied on in-person meetings that have been prevented by national lockdowns and pandemic regulations. I've been impressed with the innovative ways that activities have been adapted for online delivery. The new WAGGGS digital platform for learning and community will help us to continue embracing digital solutions.

Nevertheless, I am looking forward to Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting face-to-face activities re-emerging as the pandemic is gradually beaten. I know the girls will continue to bring their energy, creativity and resilience to the challenges around them. I also know OB-PS members will continue to bring your skills and resources, alongside ours in the staff team, to enable those girls and young women to develop their fullest potential. Thank you!
