



## **Privacy Notice for Patients**

In providing your Orthodontic care and treatment we will ask for information about you and your health. We may receive information from other providers who have been involved in providing your care.

The law determines how organisations can use personal information. The key laws are:

- The Data Protection Act 2018
- UK General Data Protection Regulations (Jan 2021)
- The Human Rights Act 1998
- Relevant Health Service Legislation
- The Common Law Duty of Confidentiality

Wallasey Orthodontics uses personal and confidential information for a number of purposes. This Privacy Notice describes the type of personal information we hold, why we hold it and what we do with it.

### **About us:**

We are Wallasey Orthodontics operating at 154 Belvidere Road, Wallasey CH45 4PT.

The Registered Manager is responsible for keeping secure the information about you that we hold. Those at the Practice who have access to your information includes the Practice Owner/Principal Orthodontist, Orthodontic Therapists, Dental Nurses, and the Registered Manager who supports the Data Protection Officer.

Our Data Protection Officer, Maria Gibson ensures that the Practice complies with Data Protection requirements to ensure that we collect, use, store and dispose of your information responsibly. ### **Information that we hold:**

We can only keep and use information for specific reasons set out in the law. If we want to keep and use information about your health, we can only do so in particular circumstances. Below, we describe the information we hold and why and the lawful basis for collecting and using it.

## **Contact details:**

We hold personal information about you including your name, date of birth, gender, NHS number, address, emergency contacts/ next of kin, telephone number and email address. This information allows us to fulfil our Contract with you and the NHS where applicable to provide appointments. We will also use the information to send you reminders and recall appointments as we have a legitimate interest to ensure your continuing care and to make you aware of our services.

## **Dental Records:**

We hold information about your dental and general health, including:

- Clinical records made by dentists and other dental professionals involved with your care and treatment
- X-rays, clinical photographs, digital 3D scans of your mouth and teeth and study models
- Medical and Dental histories including any medication that you may be prescribed by your Dentist or your Doctor
- Treatment Plans and consent
- Notes of conversations with you about your care
- Dates of your appointments
- Details of any complaints you have made and how these complaints were dealt with
- Correspondence with you and other health professionals or institutions

We collect and use this information to allow us to fulfil our Contract with you and the NHS where applicable to discuss your treatment options and provide Orthodontic care that meets your needs. We also use this information for the legitimate interest of ensuring the quality of the treatment we provide.

## **Financial Information:**

Where your Orthodontic care is provided under the terms of the NHS, we are required to complete statutory forms to allow payments to be processed. This is an NHS requirement.

If you are having private treatment we hold information about the fees we have charged, the amounts you have paid and some payment details. This information forms part of our contractual obligation to you to provide Orthodontic care and allows us to meet legal financial requirements.

## **How we use your information:**

To provide you with Orthodontic care and treatment that you need, we require up-to-date and accurate information about you.

We will seek your preference for how to contact you about your Orthodontic care. Our usual methods are telephone, emails, WhatsApp, text or letter.

We will share your information with the NHS and if applicable our Finance Partners Medenta in connection with your Orthodontic treatment.

We may contact you to conduct patient surveys or to find out if you are happy with the treatment you received for quality control purposes.

On occasion we may ask your permission to use your information for Orthodontic Education. We will discuss this with you and seek your consent. Depending on the purpose and if possible, we will anonymise your information. If this is not possible we will inform you and discuss your options.

We may use your contact details to inform you of products and services available at our Practice.

We may use your contact details to ask your permission to use your information for our Website or Facebook. We will discuss this with you and seek your explicit consent.

## **Sharing Information**

Your information is normally used only by those working at the Practice but there may be instances where we need to share it – for example, with:

- Your doctor
- The hospital or community dental services or other health professionals caring for you
- Specialist dental or medical services to which we may refer you
- NHS payment authorities
- Dental Laboratories
- Debt collection Agencies
- Financial Partner Medenta

We only discuss your information on a need-to-know basis and will limit any information that we share to the minimum necessary. We will let you know in advance if we send your medical information to another medical provider and we will give you the details of that provider at that time.

In certain circumstances or if required by law, we may need to disclose your information to a third party not connected with your health care, including HMRC or other law enforcement or government agencies.

## **National data opt-out policy**

Wallasey Orthodontics is one of many organisations working in the health and care system to improve care for patients and the public.

Whenever you use a health or care service (A&E or community care services, for example), personal information is collected and stored on your patient record to ensure that you receive the best and most appropriate care and treatment. The information collected can also be used by and provided to other organisations for purposes beyond your individual care, for example, to provide better health and care for you, your family and future generations by:

- Improving the quality and standards of care provided
- Research into the development of new treatments
- Preventing illness and diseases
- Monitoring safety
- Planning services.

Information about your health and care is confidential and can only be used where allowed by law. Mostly, information used for research and planning is anonymised so that you cannot be identified; your confidentiality is maintained.

You can choose whether you want your confidential information to be used in this way. If you are happy with this use of your information, you do not need to do anything. If you wish to opt out, your confidential information will be used only to support your individual care.

You can change your choice at any time.

Your information will not be shared with insurance companies or used for marketing purposes without your specific agreement

## **Keeping your information safe:**

We store your personal information securely on our Practice computer system. We use high-quality specialist dental software to record and use your personal information safely and effectively. Our computer system has a secure audit trail and we back-up information daily through an external provider. The Practice conducts a secondary back-up independent of the external provider daily on a separate hard drive that is stored securely.

We use cloud computing facilities for storing some of your information. The practice has a rigorous agreement with our providers to ensure that we meet the obligations described in this Privacy Notice and that we keep your information securely.

Your information cannot be accessed by those who do not work at the Practice; only those working at the Practice have access to your information. They understand their legal responsibility to maintain confidentiality and follow Practice procedures to ensure this. Employees are trained appropriately to keep your data secure.

We take precautions to ensure security of the Practice Premises and Computers.

We will retain your Orthodontic records while you are a Practice patient and after you cease to be a patient for at least eleven years or for children until age 25/26 whichever is the longest. We review the records of patients who have not re-attended after 10 years and a decision will be taken by the Principal Orthodontist on whether or not to destroy the records. It may be that your records will be retained indifferently in case you re-attend or a subsequent dental professional requests information on past treatments.

## **Access to your information and other rights:**

You have a right to access the information that we hold about you and to receive a copy. We do not usually charge you for copies of your information; if we pass on a charge, we will explain the reasons.

You can also request us to:

- Correct any information that you believe is inaccurate or incomplete. If we have disclosed that information to a third party, we will let them know about the change
- Erase some of the information we hold. For legal reasons, we may be unable to erase certain information (for example, information about the Orthodontic treatment). However, we can if you ask us to, delete some contact details and other non-clinical information
- Stop using your information – for example sending you reminders for appointments or information about our service. Even if you have given us consent to send you marketing information, you may withdraw that consent at any time
- Stop using information if you believe the information is inaccurate or you believe we are using your information illegally
- Supply your information electronically to another Orthodontist or Dentist

If we are relying on your consent to use your personal information for a particular purpose, you may withdraw your consent at any time and we will stop using your information for that purpose.

**If you do not agree:**

If you do not wish us to use your personal information as described, you should discuss the matter with your Orthodontist. If you object to the way that we collect and use your information, we may not be able to continue to provide your Orthodontic care.
